

100 Enroll For Church Leadership

First meeting of the 1943 Eugene Church Leadership training school, held Monday night, saw an enrollment of approximately 100. It is expected this will be increased at the second session, Monday night, Oct. 25. All meetings are held at the First Methodist church, and will be held succeeding Monday nights including Nov. 22.

Central Lutherans Mark Centennial

Members and friends of Central Lutheran church will join with 2500 congregations all over America Sunday, in celebrating the 100th anniversary of the Lutheran Synod, at the 11 o'clock morning service. Pastor Aalbu will preach on the theme: "What's Past Is Prelude," and the choir will sing.

In 1843, the first log church was built by a few pioneers in Muskego, Wis., from which the Lutheran church in America has grown. A picture of this little church will be printed on the cover of centennial folders to be used at the Sunday service.

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Chandler Urges Loggers' Release

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22. (AP)—Senator Chandler (D-Ky.) proposed today that wood pulp be declared a strategic material and that enough trained loggers be released from the armed services to forestall a further newsprint shortage.

"The precedent was set last year through the release of several thousand miners to mine strategic minerals," Chandler said in a statement. He added:

"The current shortage of wood pulp, from which newsprint is made, has reached serious proportions. There should be no shortage of newsprint in this country. We have the necessary material, we have the trained men, and we need the newspapers."

"Two things have contributed to this condition, first, an apparent lack of a definite policy in the distribution of the available supply and second, the fact that many loggers producing the necessary material in the forest from which wood pulp is made were either drafted or allowed to go into higher paid jobs in the ship yards and industrial plants without due regard to their value in their own work."

Bandon Lumber Firm Issued Certificate

SALEM, Ore., (AP)—Corporation Commissioner Lloyd B. Smith announced an issuer's registration certificate had been issued the Moore Mill and Lumber Co., of Bandon, Ore., and an issuer's registration statement had been filed for the Columbia Shipbuilding Co., Inc., of Portland.

The Moore company listed \$200,000 of seven per cent first mortgage bonds for use as working capital, and Columbia registered \$50,000 of capital stock to be used for operating expenses.

Bond Sales Campaign Nets \$7200 at Prison

SALEM, Ore., (AP)—Prisoners and employees at the Oregon state penitentiary bought \$7200 of bonds and stamps during the third war loan drive, Gov. Earl Snell reported.

Maury Maverick, director of the War Production board, has written a letter to Governor Snell expressing appreciation for the prisoners' response.

He said prisoners and employees at state prisons had been asked to contribute \$300,000, enough to buy a bomber, but the response was nearly a million dollars and three bombers would be purchased and named by the prisoners.

He is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Maxine Johannesen of Marshfield.
