

Says Missions Still to Live Spite of War

Dr. Vance H. Webster, resident chairman of the Laymen's Missionary Movement for Eugene, in discussing the 13th annual observance of Men and Missions Sunday, Nov. 14, said: "Many uninformed persons believe that missions have become another casualty of the war."

"This is not the case," he continued. "Actually hundreds of thousands of dollars are being spent for the relief of 'orphaned' missions in all parts of the world. Men and Missions Sunday, first observed in 1931, now offers a tremendous opportunity for stressing missions as the inescapable task of every Christian man and as the hope for enduring future peace."

The number of cities participating in the observance of Men and Missions Sunday has grown from 640 in 1932 to over 3000 this year. A number of pastors and laymen of Eugene are participating.

Military Observance

In addition to observances in many local churches, there will be special services at military and naval units of the United States and Canada in all parts of the world.

"The impact of war news has made Americans more conscious of the millions of suffering people in all parts of the world," Dr. Webster said. "The Christian churches have been world minded for many years. As a result American sailors who have crashed or been shipwrecked in the Pacific sometimes have found 'fuzzy-haired natives' who have fed and nursed them back to health instead of cooking and eating them as might have been the case fifty years earlier."

Young People of All Churches in Meeting

The Eugene Interdenominational Youth group will hold a "sing-along" meeting Sunday evening, Nov. 14, starting at 9 p. m., at the Church of the Nazarene, as the first of several planned fall and winter meetings. The plan is to get young people of all churches together for fun and fellowship, following their separate church meetings on Sunday evenings. All Christian young folk are invited to participate.

Rev. Fulton Speaker, Leadership School

Rev. E. J. Fulton, pastor of the Lighthouse Temple, will be the speaker at the mid-evening assembly period Monday night, at the Church Leadership school. This will be the fifth of the six weekly sessions of the school, in which 125 now are enrolled.

Rev. Fulton's topic will be the scheduled one, "Train All You Enlist," continuing a series of related topics.
