

Control Put Hard Wheat

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5.—(AP)—OPA has brought hard wheat under price control for the first time and boosted the maximum price for soft wheat, setting for all classes of the grain a ceiling of at least 100 per cent of parity.

The new prices, effective Tuesday, cover sales by producers and all other distributors, and take into consideration the fact that growers under oil conservation and domestication act or other government subsidies to farmers.

The basic price of hard wheat established at \$1.63 a bushel, number one winter wheat at \$1.64, and \$1.64 1/2 for number one heavy dark red spring wheat at Minneapolis.

Soft wheat the revised price of \$1.72 a bushel of number one wheat at the principal terminals of Chicago and St. Louis, compared with \$1.66 in the final regulation issued in November.

These prices, OPA explained, insure the usual commission man's margin of 1 1/2 cents a bushel.

Less of soft wheat in 34 states placed under specific ceiling Nov. 6, 1943. The new action, ending this control to all wheat, follows by about a month the inauguration of a flour sub-program designed to absorb the difference between current costs and wheat costs as presented in OPA's flour ceiling.

MEATS AND FATS

January 2—Brown stamp S, Book 3, became valid. R also good Both expire Jan. 29.

January 3—"Spare" stamp 2, Book 4, became valid for five points worth of fresh pork and sausage until Jan. 15.

January 29—Brown stamps R and S, Book 3, expire.

PROCESSED FOODS
January 29—Green stamps D, E, and F, all in Book 4, expire.

February 29—Green stamps G, H, and J, Book 4, expire.

SUGAR
January 15—Stamp 29, Book 4, for five pounds of sugar, expires.

SHOES
Stamp 18, Book 1, and Airplane stamp 1, Book 3, each good indefinitely for one pair of shoes.

FUEL OIL
February 8—Period 2 coupons in fuel oil rations expire. Period 3 coupons expire March 14.

GASOLINE
January 21—No. 9 stamps in A book expire at midnight.

TIRES
February 29—Next tire inspection deadline for holders of B and C books. A-book deadline March 31. B book tire inspection every 6 months or 5,000 miles of driving.

U. S. Minerals Dwindling Warns Interior Chief

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—Reporting \$8,000,000,000 worth of minerals, an all-time record, was dug, scooped and pumped from United States soil in 1943, Interior Secretary Ickes has expressed concern over dwindling resources and called for measures to assure this country "its share of the world's minerals at fair prices."

He raised the question of "how much longer we can continue to lead the world in mineral output" and to enjoy a large measure of self-sufficiency.

The secretary made public year-end estimates by the bureau of mines, headed by Dr. R. R. Sayers.

The physical volume of minerals produced in 1943 went up 3 per cent. Because of higher prices their value went up 6 per cent.

Among the materials in which production records were broken were aluminum, magnesium, bituminous coal, oil, and natural gas.
