

### 'Dark Victory' First Campus Play of '44

First University theatre production of 1944 will be "Dark Victory," famous stage play and later a film, which will open January 21 at the annual Dad's day program.

The program features in leading roles Ksy Korn, junior in English, Eugene, and Frank H. Krasnowsky, physics instructor. Miss Korn will have the part of Judith Trahearn, an arrogant young society girl who suffers from a mortal brain affliction. The part was played on the stage by Tallulah Bankhead, and on the screen by Bette Davis. Miss Korn has appeared in several Very Little Theatre plays, and assisted Horace W. Robinson, director of the new show, in direction of "Out of the Frying Pan" last term.

Krasnowsky, playing opposite Miss Korn as the brilliant brain specialist, Doctor Steele, is a graduate of the University of California where he was active in all types of drama. He appeared there in "Thunder Rock" and "Our Town," and took the lead in "The Beautiful People." He came to Eugene a few months ago as a physics instructor for the army, and is now directing an all-army show which will be presented later in the term.

Margie Robinson, Eugene, is assisting Robinson in directing "Dark Victory."

### Mayor and Council Argue Over Need for Roosters in Hen Yard

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Mayor Fletcher Bowron and the city council are deadlocked on whether backyard hens need their morale lifted by the presence of roosters in the flock. The council said the crowing roosters were disturbing the sleep of war workers.

The council decided the roosters must go, and drew up an ordinance banning them from residential areas.

Bowron vetoed it. It would prevent chicken raising in most backyards of the city, he said. Patriots shouldn't mind a little crowing.

Councilman Harold H. R. By jumped up at the council meeting and shouted:

"The mayor doesn't know a chicken from a hole in the ground!"

Roosters, Councilman Vernon Rasmussen added, haven't anything to do with chickens. You just buy the little chicks. They grow up and you get rid of the roosters and the hens lay eggs and that's all there is to it.

"A lot of people," he said, "have the general misunderstanding that roosters must be raised with backyard flocks of chickens.

"They keep roosters around, not because they need them to increase egg production, but because they think the hens will feel better."

### Teachers Seek Minimum Salary of \$1500 Yearly

ASTORIA (AP) — A minimum salary of \$1500 annually for teachers will be asked by the Clatsop county chapter of the State Teachers association this year, a committee of teachers has announced.

A hospitalization plan and provision for sick leaves also will be requested at the next meeting of the state association, the committee said.

### Suicides of War Prisoners Listed

OMAHA, Neb., Jan. 13.—(AP)—The 7th service command revealed today in an official statement that at least one German officer has committed suicide at the Concordia, Kan., war prisoner camp while fellow prisoners, who found him guilty of treason in a kangaroo court martial, waited outside his door.

Two and perhaps three German prisoners of war have committed suicide at the Concordia camp in recent weeks. The third, Pvt. Franz Kettner, 39, of Austrian descent, was buried yesterday. He slashed his wrists in the camp guard house where he was placed at his own request after telling camp officials "they're after me."

The others were listed as Capt. Felix Tropschuh, who hanged himself last October, after a kangaroo court martial on charges of "making remarks against Hitler," and Capt. Gustav Dorman, who died last August.

Authorities at the Concordia camp said the German private, Kettner, was "definitely anti-Nazi and feared for his life because the Nazis in the camp had discovered the fact."

### Multnomah Democrat Club Head Re-elected

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 13.—(AP)—William Bartholomew of Portland today began his second year as president of the Multnomah County Democratic club following his re-election to that office here last night.

Members of the club passed a resolution commending city officials for action in formulating the Moses plan for Post-war Portland and urged Mayor Earl Riley to aid Portland clubs and civic groups in following the program.
