Flier Stricken Blind Lands Plane Safely

CHICO, Calif., Jan. 15.—(P)—Stricken blind suddenly while he was at the controls of a one-man training plane, aviation cadet R. D. Seale, 23, Taft, Calif., brought the craft to the ground successfully Thursday under the guidance of an officer who calmly directed him from a radio control tower.

Lieut. Col. C. W. Thaxton, in the army field control tower, heard Seale screaming over the radio that he had gone blind. Thaxton talked to him calmly, instilling in Seale confidence and courage. Every move of the plane was directed by Thaxton to Seale over the radio, even to a sharp bank necessary to bring the plane to the ground safely.

Physicians at the army hospital said Seale's blindness was of a temporary nature.

Market Reports

EUGENE
The price of eggs is again at a standstill in the local markets after having dropped every few days for the past two or three weeks.

There was little change in the local prices of produce.

At the public market Saturday there was a good supply of poultry for Sunday dinners and a large variety of vegetables and seasonal fruits to choose from.

At O'Connell's and Webb's big fruit and vegetable stall, many fresh fruits have just arrived from Texas and there was a big supply of local and California products on hand.

CATTLE for week, salable 2,500, calves 260, week's market uneven, most classes drab but fair clearance. Steers mostly steady to 20c lower, some late sales 50c off; beef cows largely 50c down.

HOGS for week, salable 9,100 (largest since first week in January, 1929); market unevenly lower in advance 4.00 in 19 years, top 75c lower, most weights at similar decline but some heavies steady on support basis.

NEW YORK
Buyers converged on rail securities in today's market and vigorous bidding lifted favored fractions to a variety of so on the largest Saturday stock turnover since mid-September.

Overnight settlement of the wage dispute with the operating brotherhoods and brightening chances of profitable reorganization for a number of roads helped put both carrier stocks and bonds out in front at the opening.

Volume ran to around 800,000 shares. Scattered specialty stocks continued to exhibit strength but leading industrials and utilities generally followed a narrow course.
