Dinty Celebrates

Celebrating its sixteenth anniversary in Eugene this week is Dinty's Trading Post, 120 West Eighth avenue. The business was organized in January, 1928, by J. E. "Dinty" Moore, was a bicycle store and repair shop. Since branching out into the present trading post idea the store has been enlarged until now its 24,000 square feet of floor space is filled with countless items of new and used merchandise.

"Dinty" Moore, in recalling the ups and downs of his business over the past 16 years, remembers well the time 10 years ago last October when his business was sold for taxes. Since then his firm has come back to show phenomenal growth.

In addition to new and used merchandise the firm boasts a repair department for garden tools. Due to a shortage of blank keys resulting from the war effort, the former locksmith business conducted by the firm was recently terminated.

Dinty has long been one of Lane county's leading sports figures. His shop has been the scene of many organization meetings for baseball and softball leagues in the area. Not only has Moore sponsored both baseball for young men and softball for young women, but for many years was president of the Big-Six circuit, a present wartime casualty.

Bicycle racing has also been promoted by Dinty, and one of the largest events in local history was staged by the sportsman at the fairgrounds a few years ago.

Federal Printing Costs 134 Million

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — The federal government's total bill for printing and binding during the fiscal year 1943 amounted to \$134,518,000, according to statistics made public by the house appropriations committee. Processing and duplicating services cost another \$14,171,000.

Budget Director Harold D. Smith testified that many tons of paper had been saved through elimination of certain government questionnaires and the standardization of stationery. Another budget bureau official estimated the saving would amount to around \$2,000,000 and "nearly five tons" of paper.

Rep. Richard B. Wigglesworth, (R., Mass.) cited postoffice department figures showing the federal government had increased its use of paper in the past 10 years from 21,000 to 147,000 tons. Smith contended the war production board accounted for much of the increase.
