

What Goes on at The Statehouse

SALMON, Ore. (AP)—State treasury deposits by the Oregon racing commission in 1943 totaled \$233,217.18, more than half again as much as was deposited in the previous high year of 1942, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, Jr., reported here.

Maximum amounts allowed by law were allocated to the Oregon state fair, which received \$35,000; the Pacific International livestock exposition, held in North Portland, \$35,000; the Pendleton roundup, \$50,000; the eastern Oregon livestock show, held at Union, \$50,000; then other western turkey show, held in Douglas county, \$12,000.

Last year each county received \$127.78 as its share of a \$12,777,600 county fair fund. It was an approximate 65 per cent increase over the previous high year of 1942, when each county got \$11,977.22.

A 1939 law provides one-sixth of the three per cent collected as the state proportion of the gross amount wagered at licensed racetracks, to be credited to the state general fund. Last year the racing commission's apportionments, double the amount it received when the 1939 act went into effect.

Since racing funds apportionment was begun in 1933, apportionments totaling \$1,274,430.49 have been apportioned to the general fund and state and county funds. Of this amount the general fund has received \$1,018,685.85, and state, \$1,172,430.49.

The Oregon state fair has received a total of \$349,573.53, and the Pacific International livestock association \$349,573.53, both being allowed by law 31 1/2 per cent, or not more than \$35,000 in any one year.

The Pendleton roundup has received \$43,260 of a possible maximum of \$50,000 during the past nine years. The roundup is entitled to five per cent, but no more than \$50,000 in any one year. Only in 1935 and in 1936 did it receive less than the maximum allotment.

The eastern Oregon livestock show received the same percentage as the Pendleton roundup, and also received \$43,260 of a maximum of \$50,000.

The northwestern turkey show in Douglas county has received \$1,688 during the past nine years, and only in the first year did it receive less than the maximum \$1,800 allowed by law.

County fairs have received \$376,409.59, the 1943 apportionment jumping to \$112,600.08 from the 1942 level of \$43,099.92. This amount is divided equally among the counties.

The racing commission authorizes and regulates thoroughbred horse and animal racing under an act of 1933. It licenses and supervises race meets and may discipline licensees who violate the Oregon law regarding pool selling, book making, handbook circulation, or who conduct wagering by other than the mutual system.

Henry W. Collins of Portland is chairman of the commission.
