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K. C. CONVENTION SET

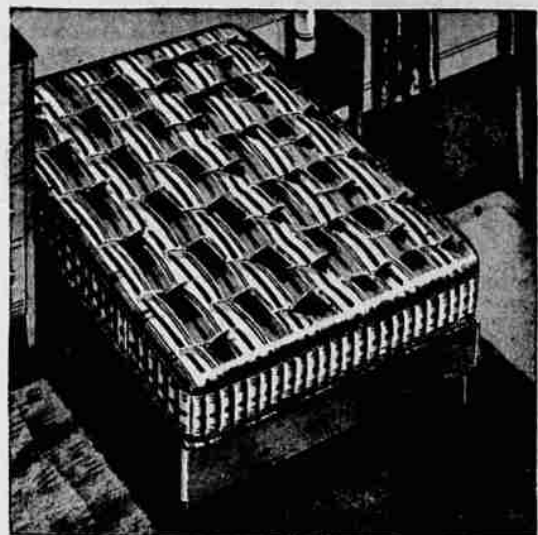
OREGON CITY, Feb. 1.—(U.S.)—The 1944 state convention of Knights of Columbus will be held in Portland, May 27-28. State and

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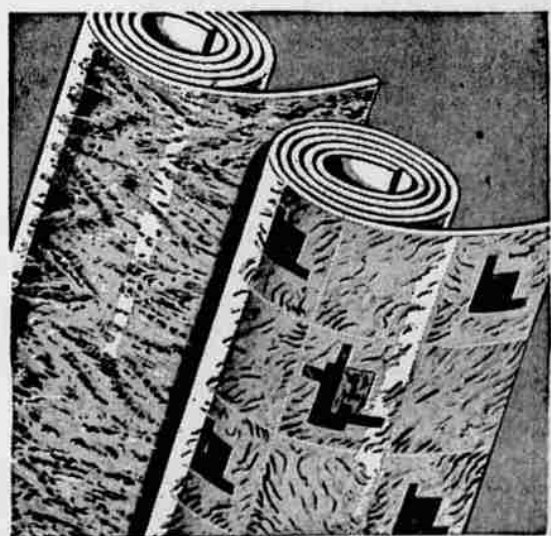

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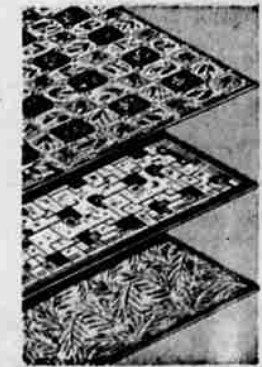
