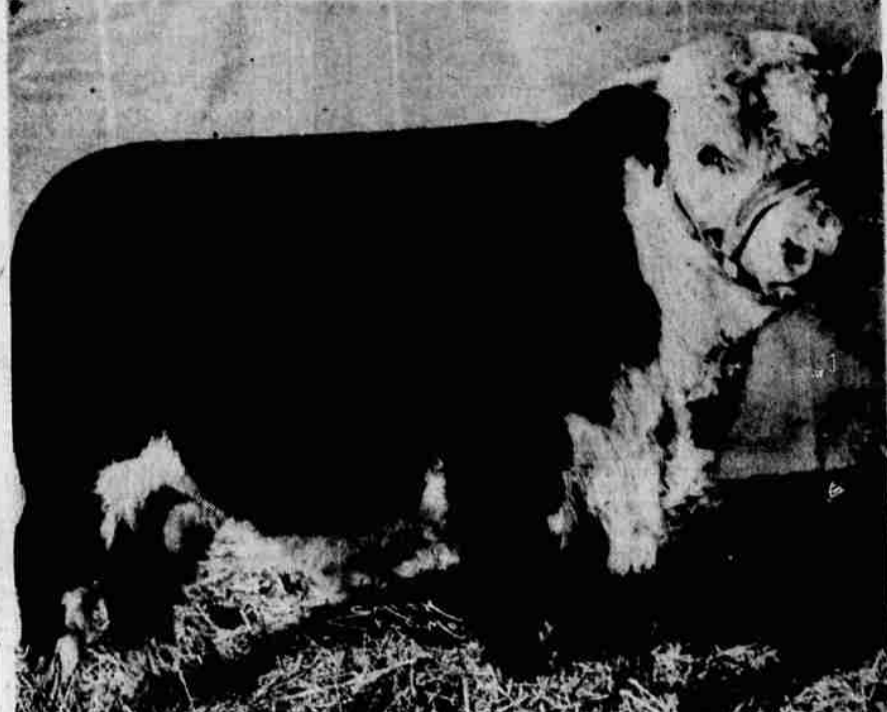
Secretaries Assemble Here
