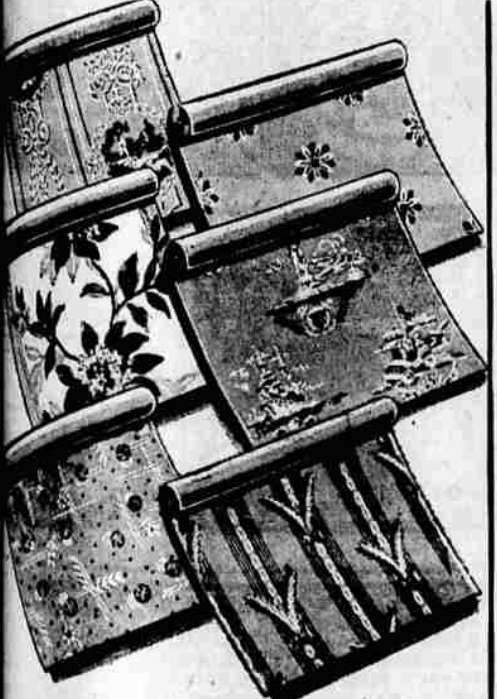
**Patent Suit Settled**

Pride in Eugene for its recognition in "Yank," and special praise to the Red Cross are expressed in a letter from Major Dale O. Phetteplace, now in England, to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. E. Phetteplace, Springfield, Major Phetteplace is a brother of Dr. Carl H. Phetteplace of Eugene. Parts of his letter follow:

"... I am sending under separate cover, a copy of the U. S. army weekly magazine for the ETO—'Yank.' Just to show you how famous Lane county is becoming, read the first article. So far as I know Eugene is the only city in the USA to have had that much advertising. I must say it makes me proud of the town. Incidentally, this magazine 'Yank,' and the daily paper, 'Stars and Stripes,' are both darn good publications and something the army can well be proud of. They answer a crying need over here."

"And while I am on the subject, here is a big hand to the Red Cross. They have provided more for the American soldier over here than anyone realizes, because we have such a nasty habit of taking things like that for granted. But when it is all over, I believe we will all remember the Red Cross for a mighty long time. Certainly, they will not have to beg me for my contribution."

After telling about some of his trips around England, Major Phetteplace says "for my money in England, I'll take the country and the small villages. They are beautifully picturesque and the people are human."

**Paper Drive Extended**

The Eugene scrap paper drive has been extended another week thus giving Eugene and Lane residents a second chance to donate their old papers and cardboard boxes to the war effort.

Because freight clearance was not available Sunday for Eugene's stack of collected waste paper, junior chamber of commerce officials conducting the drive decided to carry on another week.

More than 90 tons of waste paper are in the warehouse at 88 High street, waiting to be sent to Longview paper mills to be reclaimed. Jaycees urge Eugeneans to add on to that 90 tons during the next week.

Hours at the warehouse will be from 10 to 12 noon and from 1 to 5. Paper will be collected through Sunday, March 13, the date of shipment.

The air medal with oak leaf clusters was awarded posthumously at the Portland army air base to Lt. John D. Williams Jr., former University of Oregon student who was killed near Naples, Italy.

**KANSAS CITY, March 7.—(AP)—**Dr. William J. Kerr of Portland, Ore., was elected grand master of the order of DeMolay at the meeting of the grand council Monday. Kerr is chancellor emeritus of higher education in Oregon.
