Mexican Workers Due Here June 29

First contingent of 35 Mexican nationals to assist Lane county farmers in harvesting food crops will leave Mexico City June 24 and are due to arrive in Eugene June 29, it was announced at a meeting Wednesday afternoon of the sponsoring committee of Lane county farmers who have applied for these nationals in harvesting their crops.

The crew of 35 to arrive the latter part of the month will help pick sweet cherries. The number to be brought here for different crops will range as high as 180 and possibly 175 in the latter part of August and the first of September.

O. B. Hardy of Portland, field representative of the war food administration, attended the meet-

ing Wednesday afternoon and discussed housing for these nationals. The WFA will provide housing and take charge of the feeding of the nationals while they are here and will look after their general welfare. In addition to housing and feeding, Hardy discussed payroll records, field supervision and general problems in handling this imported labor.

The committee elected Alvin Crocker, Eugene RFD 1, as treasurer of the group and designated the chairman, secretary and treasurer as an executive committee. H. V. Jenkins, Creswell RFD 1, is chairman and R. V. Rogers, Eugene RFD 1, secretary. Minor business of the committee will be transacted by the executive committee without calling the entire group together.

Jenkins presided at the meeting Wednesday afternoon and present were Harry Bower, of the farm labor office and O. S. Fletcher, county agent, who took part in the discussion.

De Gaulle Sets Up Own French Regime

LONDON, June 15.—(AP)—Gen. Charles DeGaulle announced today that he has ordered his representatives in the liberated area of Normandy to establish their own civil administrations in the name of his provisional French government.

The dramatic move to establish the provisional government's authority over liberated French soil was announced in a special communique issued by the De Gaulle headquarters here.

A spokesman for the Free French leader said the civil administration would be independent of the civil affairs office established by the allied military authorities in Normandy.

DeGaulle announced that Francois Coulet, former director of the commissariat of the interior in the provisional government at Algiers, had been sent to France to take over the duties of "commissioner of the republic for Normandy" to handle civil administration in the liberated territory.

The French move threatened to bring to a swift test the months-old refusal of Great Britain and the United States to recognize De Gaulle's provisional government as the civil authority in liberated metropolitan France.

Doolittle, then only a lieutenant colonel but now a lieutenant general commanding the eighth air force in Britain, had carried out that adventurous mission.

The Mitchells flew from the aircraft carrier Hornet and after crossing Japan flew on to the continent. One landed in eastern Siberia, the others in China. Some of them came down in Japanese-held territory and a few of the fliers were taken captive. Months later the Japanese themselves made it known that some of these prisoners had been executed.

Superintendent Gunn To Arrive Here

Henry M. Gunn, who will become superintendent of Eugene schools on July 1, is expected to arrive here Friday to begin preliminary work on the job, the city schools office said Thursday. Dr. Gunn has been assistant superintendent of Portland schools, and will take the post to be vacated by Dr. J. F. Cramer, who will become dean and director of the extension division, Oregon state system of higher education.

Clarence Hines, the new assistant superintendent, has arrived and taken residence at 1108 Monroe. He formerly was principal at Pendleton high school.

Allies Break Nazi Resistance In Italy

ROME, June 15.—(AP)—Allied troops, breaking the stiffening German resistance of the last three days, have made a general advance all along their line in Italy, taking Orvieto, Aquila and Narni and pushing onward, allied headquarters announced today.

Orvieto is 57 miles northwest of Rome, Narni, 41 miles north, and Quila, 54 miles northeast. Along the west coast the fifth army has advanced 79 miles beyond Rome.

Fifth army troops along the west coast met determined enemy resistance at Magliano, 11 miles northeast of Orvieto, but swept it aside and entered the town.

In the Lake Bolsena area French troops continued to advance and the Americans reached Pitigliano, 11 miles west of the northern end of the lake, and sent reconnaissance elements farther.

Allied troops in the Adriatic sector are across the Saline river. Allied heavy bombers attacked oil refineries in the Budapest area and northern Yugoslavia while medium bombers attacked rail targets on the Italian east coast and south of Florence.

Fifteen German planes were destroyed in all operations and 18 allied aircraft were missing.

Soviet Fleet Backs Drive On Viipuri

MOSCOW, June 15.—(AP)—Soviet warships of the Baltic fleet steamed in close to the Karelian isthmus shore today and poured broadsides into Finnish strong points in support of three red army columns battling their way toward Viipuri.

Concrete pillboxes and artillery emplacements were pulverized by the naval bombardment and by an artillery barrage laid down by soviet guns arrayed wheel to wheel in some sectors, front dispatches reported.

LONDON, June 15.—(AP)—Russian troops, bearing down with tanks, artillery and air support, are inflicting heavy casualties on the Finns on the Karelian front and have advanced to within 25 miles of the seaport of Viipuri, Moscow declared today.

With their capital city of Helsinki, 150 miles northwest of Viipuri, endangered by the soviet offensive, the Finns have thrown strong reinforcements into a fierce struggle with the red army in the area of Kuterselka and Jarvi, a broadcast communique from Moscow said.

Russian troops have penetrated the Finnish lines at Kuterselka, the Finns acknowledged today in a communique broadcast from Berlin. The bulletin also said Viipuri was attacked last night by 150 soviet planes.

Moscow declared German reconnaissance units southeast of Stanislawow in old Poland had been repulsed.

Fire Razes Half Block In Gardiner

GARDINER, Ore., June 15.—(AP)—Fire raced through a half-block of this small coastal town early today, razing the three-story Gardiner tavern and the I.O.O.F. building and damaging a confectionery store.

All the occupants of the tavern, a 40-room hotel, escaped. A grocery, which was to be sold today, burned to the ground at a loss estimated by owners at \$3000.

The Reedsport fire department and a coast guard fire boat from Umpqua fought two hours before controlling the blaze, apparently started by a burning flue. Owners estimated hotel damage at \$45,000, and the I.O.O.F. building loss at \$5,000.

Ballot 'Nightmare' Continues In Idaho

A politician's nightmare continued Thursday in the counting of returns in Idaho's close race for the democratic nomination for the senate with a narrow margin separating the leaders.

When 715 of the state's 845 precincts had reported results Tuesday's primary, an unofficial count showed: Sen. D. W. Clark, 10,017 votes and Glen T. Tello, 10,017. James H. Hawk, Boise attorney, was trailing. The see-sawing race indicated that official canvass June 24 will be necessary to determine the winner.
