

Final Official Vote for Primary Tallied

SALEM, Ore.—U.P.—Final, complete and official votes for the primary election were reported here by the secretary of the state, following the canvass of votes by the governor, state treasurer and the secretary of state.

Gov. Thomas E. Dewey of New York and President Roosevelt were the biggest vote getters in the presidential voting, with Dewey getting 50,001 republican votes and Roosevelt netting 79,887 democratic votes.

Scattered writeins other than Dewey on the republican ballot included: Stassen, 6,061; Becker, 3,018; Willkie, 3,333. Democratic writeins were few, 1,184 scattered.

For the democratic vice presidential nomination, Henry Wallace got 10,441 votes, Alben Barkley 318 and Sam Rayburn 37, with 461 votes scattered.

Republican vice presidential nominees included: Earl Warren 1,184; Stassen 2,155; Dewey 929; Becker 1,184; Willkie 483, and 1,184 scattered.

Wayne L. Morse, candidate for the republican nomination for the next term in the U. S. senate, gained the largest number of votes, 70,715 to Rufus Holman's 60,436, and Earl E. Fisher's 12,241.

Edgar W. Smith received 49,077 votes in the democratic nomination race for the same post to Walter W. Whitbeck's 29,852.

Willis Mahoney, unopposed democratic nominee for senate, next term, received 72,067 votes. Guy Cordon, winner of the republican nomination, received 68,666 votes, compared with 63,944 for Charles Sprague, 6,106 for Henry Black and 5,065 for John McBride.

Results of the race for the national committeemen's posts:

Ralph Calk (R) 87,892; Charles G. Paine (R) 43,047; Howard Latourette (D) 29,619; Lew Wallace (D) 34,375; Clarence F. Hyde (D) 26,839.

Mrs. George Gerlinger, running unopposed for the post of republican national committeewoman, received 103,988 votes.

Nancy Honeyman Robinson gained 47,035 votes in the race for democratic national committeewoman, while Emily F. Edson received 37,559.

In the races for representatives in congress, the canvass showed the following results:

1st district: (republican) James W. Mott, 28,231; Dan Harmon 14,526; (democratic) O. Henry Oleen, 15,874.

2nd district: (republican) Lowell Stockman 17,025; (democratic) C. J. Shorb 8,978.

3rd district: (republican) Homer D. Angell, 47,267; (democratic) Lester Sheeley, 22,726.

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Black Says He Didn't Get Enough Publicity

WASHINGTON, (AP) — Henry Black, Portland, Ore., told the senate campaign expenditures committee he would have won the nomination to complete the four-year term of the late Senator Charles L. McNary if he had received one-fourth as much "free publicity" as his opponents.

Sen. Guy Cordon (R., Ore.) won the nomination over Black and former Gov. Charles A. Sprague of Salem.

Black said he believed newspapers mailing privileges should be "compelled" to give all candidates equal amount of space and suggested that candidates for congress be permitted to send their campaign advertising through the mails free of charge.

The statements were made in a report to the committee on his campaign expenses and contributions. He reported expenditures of \$1,475 but did not list any contributions.

Cordon reported receipts by the Cordon for senator committee of \$23,785 and Sprague reported approximately \$20,334 for various committees in his behalf.

Wayne L. Morse, who defeated Sen. Holman (R., Ore.) for the republican nomination for the six-year term, reported campaign receipts by his campaign committees of \$23,368 and expenditures of \$25,282.

Holman reported receipt of campaign funds totaling \$17,021 and Earl Fisher, third man in the race, listed no contributions and \$572 expenditures.

Willis Mahoney, democratic candidate for the four-year term nomination, reported no contributions and expenditures of \$250.

Edgar Smith, successful candidate for the democratic nomination for the six-year term, reported contributions of \$3,100 and expenditures of \$1,500, while his opponent, Walter Whitbeck, reported contributions of \$20 and expenditures of \$820.
