Premium Gasoline Cut Announced
WASHINGTON — (AP) — An immediate reduction in the amount of premium gasoline for civilian use was announced Thursday by Secretary Ickes because of military demands for tetraethyl lead. Ickes told a press conference he has been forced to order a cut in premium gasoline during July, and for an unpredictable number of months to come, to about 40 per cent of the supply in June.

Casualties Nearing Half Million Mark
WASHINGTON, June 23 — (AP) — American battle casualties are nearing the quarter-million mark. Secretary Stimson reported today that army casualties through June 6 (which would include D-day) totaled 178,877, an increase of 8319 since his report on June 8, which covered the period through May 21. The army dead now total 31,289, an increase of 2337. The new announcement reports 71,432 wounded, 39,976 missing and 35,980 prisoners.

CHICAGO, June 23 — (AP) — More than 350 delegates to Kiwanis international's 1944 convention Thursday elected Ben Dean, Grand Rapids, Mich., advertising executive to succeed Donald B. Rice, Oakland, Cal. J. Hudson Huffard, Bluefield, W. Va., and J. J. Smith, Regina, Saskatchewan, were elected vice presidents from the United States and Canada, while Hamilton Holt, Macon, Ga., was named treasurer.

Trustees elected for two-year terms include J. N. Emerson, Pullman, Wash. The convention closed today.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 23 — (AP) — Congressional approval of more than \$10,000,000 in appropriations for the Bonneville power administration was announced today by administrator Paul J. Raver. They included \$6,935,000 for transmission lines, of which \$485,000 was earmarked for construction of a 115,000-volt line from Grand Coulee dam to Brewster, Wash., and \$3,813,540 for operations and maintenance, including

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Q: Who was the tall blonde who interviewed contestants in "Cover Girl"? She stole the show.

A: Eve Arden, who also wisecracked her way through "Hit Parade of 1943" and the Broadway and Hollywood versions of "Let's Face It."

Q: The direction of "Phantom Lady" deserves credit. Who is responsible?

A: Robert Siodmak. He also did "Someone to Remember," but until recently his work has been confined to low-budget films such as "My Heart Belongs to Daddy" and "Son of Dracula."

Q: Why do some characters in Technicolor films always seem to be blushing?

A: This "blush" is caused by the hypersensitivity of the film itself, which picks up every hint of color and accentuates it, particularly red. Almost colorless make-up is sometimes used to offset this tendency. To help conquer Technicolor's emphasis on red hues, a new make-up compound has been developed by Clay Campbell of Columbia Studios. It consists of standard ingredients, plus an admixture of essence of chlorophyll.

the green coloring matter of plants. Called "chlorallure," the compound will be used for the first time on Rita Hayworth, Janet Blair, and other dancers in the Technicolor "Tonight and Every Night," in which it is said to provide a practically accurate flesh tint.
