Pig Crop Decrease For Oregon Likely

PORTLAND, Ore.—(UP)—Estimates place the Oregon spring pig crop at 221,000 head, or 27 per cent less than last year, according to the United States bureau of agricultural economics.

The fall pig crop is expected to be reduced even further with indications of only 240,000 head or a 51 per cent decrease from fall, 1943.

Oregon stands about even with the United States on the decline in hog production. The national spring pig crop is estimated at 24 per cent less than last year's and the fall crop is expected to decrease 33 per cent from the national fall total of last year.

Ship Tie-up Averted

SAN FRANCISCO—(UP)—A greatly increased supply of experienced volunteer seamen has averted temporarily the danger of a serious shipping tie-up in Pacific coast ports, war shipping administration officials reported.

A rush of seamen ready to ship out immediately appeared at union hiring halls and WSA recruitment headquarters following the warning last week that crew shortages were delaying departures of merchant ships loaded with vital war cargoes, WSA said.

Hoover Cousin Dies

NEWPORT, June 30—(AP)—Funeral services for Dr. Gertrude Minthorn, 62, Newport physician and cousin of former President Herbert Hoover, will be held here Monday. She died Wednesday.

She was the daughter of the late Dr. Henry J. Minthorn, founder of Pacific academy here, which was attended by Hoover when he was a boy.

Lane Receives \$20,045 Of State School Money

Lane county will receive from the state land board \$20,045 as its share of a distribution of \$294,148 to the different counties of the state, the amount being the interest on the irreducible school fund. The apportionment is for the 1943-44 school year and amounts to \$1.05 for every child between the ages of 4 and 20.

Only two counties, Multnomah and Marion will receive a higher amount than was apportioned to Lane. Multnomah gets \$87,031 and Marion \$21,359.

Pettibones Announce New Mill Projects

SPRINGFIELD—Pettibone Forest Products company has announced that it will soon complete a lumber mill on the Woodburn branch railroad on Mill street with a 15,000 board feet capacity, along with a lathe mill to manufacture strips for dowels and handles. Work has already started with grading for roadways and excavation for the pond.

Owners are C. J. Pettibone and son, C. T. Pettibone, both Springfield residents with experience in the lumber business. The plant will be of modern design with a hog to turn all refuse into fuel. The mill will be all electrical with no burner, thus cutting down the possibility of fire.

The log supply will be from independent contractors, and the owners may use some of their own timber.
