University Training Women In 30 Fields Of War Work

Training in 30 fields of war work is offered women at the University of Oregon, with courses and consultants provided, and opportunities in each field listed.

The announcement came from Karl W. Onthank, dean of personnel administration, who prepared the list for the 1944 "Welcome Book" for new students.

Government service, including local, state and federal, offers unlimited opportunity for women trained as accountants, economists, statisticians, personnel workers, teachers, nurses, journalists and secretaries. A university degree is also an asset for officer candidates in the WACS, WAVES, SPARS and marines, where the need is great for women with a knowledge of mathematics, business, technology, or personnel administration. Graduates trained in social work may become USO or Red Cross field workers in the United States and overseas, while the Red Cross offers scholarships to exceptional graduates for fifth year of professional training.

The student with a scientific inclination and a major in chemistry, may become a chemist, laboratory technician, research worker, or science teacher, or if she has a major in physics may qualify as a physicist, meteorologist, weather observer, radio technician, research worker, or technical aide. There are also openings for professional photographers

Sackett Files Suit Over Radio Deal

TACOMA, Wash., July 7.—Suit for specific performance of contract has been filed in Tacoma by Sheldon F. Sackett, Marshfield, Ore., newspaper publisher, formerly in Eugene, against Mrs. Laura M. Doernbecher, owner of the Puget Sound Broadcasting company of Tacoma.

The complaint charges that Mrs. Doernbecher—along with her daughter and co-defendant, Mrs. Vernice Irwin, Tacoma—failed to meet the terms of a contract concluded a year ago by which, it was alleged, the Tacoma radio station was to be sold to K.V.I., Inc. The corporation is a new one, formed by Sackett and Ben E. Stone, also of Marshfield, for the purpose of the transaction.

The transfer was to have been made for a cash consideration of \$125,000. However, Mrs. Doernbecher refused to recognize the contract as binding. Speaking through her attorney, E. N. Eisenhower, she said:

"The transaction never got beyond the negotiations stage. The only written agreement was a memorandum drawn up a year ago. It was not intended to be binding, nor does it constitute a formal contract."

However, Sackett said that all arrangements had been completed and that he and Stone had formed K.V.I., Inc. after filing with the secretary of state in Olympia, for the purpose of fulfilling his part of the bargain. He further pointed out that he had sent a check for \$40,000 to Mrs. Doernbecher's agent as the first payment for the station.

The complaint states that the check was returned in February, 1944, that Mrs. Doernbecher refused to carry on further negotiations and declared that the transaction was off.

The plaintiffs ask \$20,000 damages for delay if the contract is fulfilled and \$50,000 if the sale of the Tacoma radio station to K.V.I., Inc., is refused.

Coyote-Killing Fliers Rest After Bagging 90

BURNS, July 7.—(AP)—Roe Davis and William Stephenson sat down to rest today after a 10-day coyote hunt by airplane.

The two fliers, hired by Harney county sheepmen to rid the range of predators, bagged 90 animals along the sagebrush stretches of Harney county. The pelts will be sold to furriers.

Davis, the pilot, flew at straining level and Stephenson potted the coyotes with a 12-gauge shotgun as the plane swooped past within 20 feet of the ground.

Low-Flying Blimps Cause Farm Animals' Deaths

NORTH BEND, July 7.—(AP)—Low-flying blimps from a nearby navy base are causing casualties among the area's animals.

Mrs. Kenneth Miner reported one of her pet dogs died of fright after running to the protection of her arms when a blimp passed overhead. The week before a rooster crowed apparent defiance at another blimp, then fell over dead.

German Explosives Discovered In Rome

ROME, July 7.—(AP)—Allied military authorities today permitted the disclosure that a huge cache of explosives has been discovered in a secret cellar on the grounds of the German embassy in Rome.

The explosives apparently were being used by Nazi saboteurs who remained in the capital after the German evacuation.

State's Farmers Urged To Order Fertilizer

CORVALLIS, Ore., July 7.—Oregon farmers should order their 1945 supplies of fertilizer now or they may be forced to go without, Arthur S. King, OSC extension specialist in soils, said here.

He predicted that supplies will be short, despite increased allocations of fertilizers available for 1945. The manufacturers normal practice of putting on extra workers during the few months of peak demand is impossible in wartime, King said. This necessitates movement of fertilizer shipments regularly through the season instead of all at one time.
