Destruction Of Army Goods On Wholesale Scale Denied

EDMONTON, Alta., July 7.—(Canadian Press)—United States army officers today denied charges of "wholesale" destruction of equipment and material along the Alaska highway as asserted yesterday in The Vancouver, B. C., Province.

The news story, prepared by a staff correspondent, said "fires burn night and day" at Dawson Creek, B. C., to destroy large quantities of United States equipment, including unused articles such as stoves, ranges, furnaces, crockery, mattresses, sleeping bags, blankets and camp equipment.

"The excuse is that this material, brought into the country by the United States on agreement with Canada, cannot be sold or disposed of for use in the dominion," The Province declared. "It must be returned to the United States or destroyed."

Col. Frederick K. Strong, Jr., commanding the northwest service command, U. S. Army, and Maj. Gen. W. Foster, special commissioner for northwest defense projects, both issued statements asserting the paper's statements "are not true."

Col. Strong added: "The Canadian government is being given every opportunity to absorb such material as the U. S. government does not have an essential need for in the U. S. A. board of officers examines all material being salvaged and that material which, when reconditioned, will not meet the U. S. army minimum standards for salvage material, is being destroyed."

Householders Told To Buy Fuel Now

All householders should buy their cooking fuel now, immediately, at the war price and rationing board advised today in conjunction with other local boards throughout the country.

Those who burn oil, particularly, were urged to obtain their ration tickets in the new issue so that their supply may be delivered before the threatened fuel-oil shortage expected for next winter.

Coal and wood users were asked to order their 1944-45 supply, to alleviate crowded conditions at fuel supply junctions and to avoid tie-ups in distribution systems as the weather grows colder later this year.

Vegetable Markups Set

Allowed mark-ups on fresh vegetables in this area, for retail stores in the four OPA groups, were announced here Friday by the war price and rationing board.

Mark-up of 2½ cents per bunch on bunches of carrots is allowed for all groups; and 2 cents per pound on all carrots except bunches.

Other mark-ups, on a per-pound basis, are: Green and wax beans, 4½ cents in groups 1 and 2, and 4 cents in 3 and 4; hot-house cucumbers, 7 cents and 6½ cents; cucumbers except hot-houses, 2½ cents in all groups; eggplant, 3½ cents and 3 cents; sweet peppers, 5 cents and 4½ cents; spinach, 3½ cents and 3 cents.
