**Quarantine Of Wallace Flying Group Denied**  
EDMONTON, Alta., July 8.—(AP)—Reports that Vice President Henry A. Wallace and others aboard an army bomber returning from China and en route to Seattle were quarantined in Edmonton, last night were denied emphatically today by Maj. George A. Carroll, public relations officer of the army transport command, U.S. army air forces, here.

The quarantine reportedly was ordered after the co-pilot of the bomber contracted scarlet fever and was left at Grand Prairie, Alta. Carroll neither denied nor confirmed the co-pilot's illness, but merely said, "no comment."

# FDR Drops Few Hints, But They're Small

WASHINGTON, July 8.—(AP)—President Roosevelt and news correspondents engaged in another verbal joust here over his political plans and the results, with the democratic national convention only 10 days away, were as usual—barren.

The colloquy had a little more variety. Several reporters asked carefully phrased questions replete with pitfalls, but the president retained his laurels as a master of defense and repartee. When his news conference was over the scribes still didn't know: Whether he will run again.

Whether he will break his silence between now and convention time, July 19, although he dropped a vague hint.

Whether, if he does run, he wants to keep Henry Wallace as his heir-apparent.

Whether he has any platform views.

Whether he considers Thomas E. Dewey a worthy opponent.

And Democratic National Chairman Robert E. Hannegan wouldn't—if he could—answer any of the questions. After meeting for an hour, he would not admit that politics was even discussed. He responded with "no comment" to every question asked.

A persistent woman reporter whom the president chided for being a pollyanna, came closer than her male colleagues to extracting information.

"When sir," she asked, after several rebuffs, "do you think we will get answers to questions of this type?"

Mr. Roosevelt grinned and said probably sometime around November. He paused for a second and then added: even maybe this month. But if he were a reporter, he cautioned, he would not speculate.

Three weeks ago Gov. Ellis Arnall of Georgia predicted after a White House conference that Mr. Roosevelt "would take the people into his confidence" in the period between the republican and democratic conventions. He also prophesied that the president would abide by the desires of the convention—and run if nominated.

# Death of Two More German Generals Told

LONDON, (AP)—Berlin has announced that two other German generals were killed by accident recently on the same day that Col. Gen. Eduard Dietl, late Nazi commander in Finland, met his death in an airplane accident.

The other generals killed were Gen. of Infantry Emil Wickede, commanding general of an army corps who had distinguished himself early in the Russian campaign, and Gen. Karl Egiseer, commanding general of a mountain army corps.

# Miners Still Drilling For 66 Lost Workers

BELLAIRE, O., July 8.—(AP)—A rescue crew working at high speed sent a drill biting down deeper today into the earth in an effort to open a nine-inch shaft to 66 miners entombed and presumed dead in a section of the burning Powhatan coal mine near here.

The work on drilling the nine-inch shaft began last night and by morning it had been driven down 120 feet in what company officials said was "satisfactory progress. As the shaft goes deeper, however, the rate of progress will slow.

# WPB Moves to Double Can Opener Output

WASHINGTON, July 8.—(AP)—June brides got a break today from the war production board as it relaxed restrictions on the manufacture of can openers.

The new regulations permit manufacturers to use iron and steel at twice the previously permitted rate for household type can openers and at two and one-third the times the previous rate for institutional types. Size and weight restrictions on both types were removed.

Albany is believed to have been the second permanent settlement of the 13 colonies.
