

### Survey Shows Paper Waste is Lagging

Results of a recent survey by the conservative waste paper industries can be summarized as follows: Oregon is collecting less than half of the potential amount of waste paper available from homes. It was asserted in a report issued by the state salvage committee.

From Nov. 1, 1943 to June 25, 1944, the state collected 9737 tons of waste paper, or an average of 1.5 pounds per capita per month. Potential waste paper available from Oregon homes, however, should be 19.5 pounds per month, according to the estimate of the committee. The present-day inventory of salvageable waste paper available to the state is 1.5 pounds per capita per month.

### Eugene Man Held On Kidnaping Charge

Paul Kenneth Norman, 43, of Eugene, is in the county jail at Reno, Nevada, charged with kidnaping, an Associated Press dispatch reported Thursday.

The dispatch stated that Norman, a dishwasher at a Lake Tahoe resort, was charged Wednesday and confined to the county jail in lieu of \$1,000 bail. He was arrested Monday for allegedly forcing an unidentified woman to accompany him from Lake Tahoe across the California-Nevada boundary. The woman's hands showed knife wounds, Reno police said.

### Oranges Are Small

Consumers are squeezing more oranges this year than usual because there is one small orange for every two large ones from California this summer, according to current shipping records from the golden state. All of the nation's orange supply comes from California during the summer months.

"The total volume of fruit from California is normal," says R. W. Ryan, district sales manager for the California Fruit Growers Exchange, "but the size situation is far from normal. There are approximately 25,000 cars of valencias yet to be shipped, but almost 12,000 of these will be small sizes. We cannot eliminate the small sizes from the shipments for if we did, the total supply would be one-third less."

Size is not indicative of quality. Consumers will find that the small oranges have just as much juice as the larger ones, Ryan said. "Many people have been buying small oranges for years because they think them superior," he explained.

Because of the abundance of small size oranges, it is entirely possible that they will be a better buy than the larger fruit, Ryan pointed out. If the fruit bears the same recognized trademark, the consumer should buy the least expensive size.
