Pilot Rock Officer Gets DSC Award

U. S. AIR BASE IN FRANCE—(AP)—The distinguished service cross, America's second highest military award, was pinned on 25 men of the 101st airborne division here by Lt. Gen. Omar Bradley, first army commander.

A DSC award went to Lt. Col. Patrick Cassidy, Pilot Rock, Ore., who, despite severe enemy fire, personally led a unit over a bridge and then over a causeway and directed artillery fire which wiped out a machine gun nest.

Wallace Tells Mother Of Son's Injuries

INDEPENDENCE, Mo.—(AP)—Two rings on a party line phone and the two words "Washington calling" were all Mrs. Wanda Holzbaur needed here to tell her that Vice-President Henry A. Wallace was calling to tell her about his visit with her husband in a western China hospital where Wallace visited recently.

She had learned in a news dispatch from China that Wallace had visited with her husband, Sgt. George H. Holzbaur, Jr., and had promised to phone his wife as soon as he arrived back in this country.

The 18-year-old wife and mother picked up the phone and then waited anxiously until a man's voice stated, "This is Henry Wallace."

Mrs. Holzbaur proceeded to ask the vice-president about her husband, a B-29 gunner who was wounded in a recent raid over Japan in which the remainder of the crew members lost their lives. Wallace told Mrs. Holzbaur that her husband had received "65 per cent burns, the kind very few recover from." The vice-president assured the young woman that her husband's eyesight was all right although he had received serious face burns.

When asked if the air corps sergeant would come home when released from the hospital, Wallace said, "Yes, I believe he will be home as soon as a way can be found for him to come."

Mrs. Holzbaur said the vice-president followed five-minute rule on conversations and that at the end of the conversation he agreed to write her a brief note concerning his visit with her husband for the family records.

Forest Grove Boosts City Manager Power

FOREST GROVE, July 13—(AP)—A special \$2500 tax to provide a winter recreation program for young people was approved by Forest Grove voters, results of Monday's election showed today.

A city charter amendment making the city manager administrative head of the city also was passed. He was given power to appoint all other city officials except the city recorder, who will be elected by the city council.

Berlin Expects Patton To Command Invaders

LONDON—(AP)—The Berlin radio said recently that new landings would be made soon by an army commanded by Lt. Gen. George S. Patton, Jr., and that the drive would mark the beginning of an all-out allied assault in the west.

Berlin claimed that the force to be led by Patton, who commanded the U. S. Seventh army in the Sicilian campaign, would be the "British southeast army."

Berlin did not state whether that would be a British army led by an American general or merely an army being formed in south-eastern Britain.

"The military situation in Normandy and the east shows that we rapidly are heading toward the climax of the enemy attack against Europe and that we'll reach the climax of that storm in the near future," the enemy broadcast said.

Ration List On Farm Equipment To Be Cut

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Increased farm machinery production has made it possible to reduce from 21 to 19 the types to be left on the ration list after July 20, the war food administration said.

Overall farm machinery production is now at an annual level which approximates production in 1940—and maintenance of output at this level for the 12 months beginning July 1 is anticipated.

The 19 types of implements which will continue to be rationed include: Combines, corn binders, corn pickers, manure spreaders, mowers, side-delivery rakes, hay loaders, pick-up hay balers, tractors, grain drills, potato planters, potato diggers, silo fillers, irrigation pumps, power sprayers, garden tractors, deep and shallow well water systems, power pumps and farm milk coolers.

Convention To Get FDR Name July 20

CHICAGO—(AP)—President Roosevelt's name will be placed in nomination before the democratic national convention, along with the names of other possible candidates, the night of July 20, according to a tentative schedule adopted by the national committee.

Vice presidential nominations will be made the same evening time permits.

National Chairman Robert E. Hannegan will open the convention at noon July 19, and Gov. Robert S. Kerr, Oklahoma, will give the keynote address that night.

Adoption of a platform and presentation of committee reports is scheduled for the afternoon of July 20.

Means of Aiding Fish Commission Investigated

SALEM, Ore.—(AP)—Gov. Earl Snell has begun investigating the

legal possibilities for state financial aid to the Oregon fish commission, following an appeal from a special state fishery committee, which outlined the emergency.

The governor will consult with Atty. Gen. George Neuner regarding the legality of providing aid from the emergency fund, he said, and will attempt to ascertain any other way in which funds could be advanced to the commission.

Convening of the emergency board would depend upon the attorney general's ruling, the governor said.

The committee's report was submitted to him Wednesday, signed by Merle R. Chessman, Astoria, chairman of the senate fisheries interim committee.
