crushed plums (add water to
cup if necessary) into a large
cup. Add M.C.P. Pectin, stir well
and add the sugar (which has been
measured), mix well and
pour into a boiling hot liquid. BOIL EX-
ACTLY 4 MINUTES. Remove from
heat and stir and skim from
top. Pour into sterilized
bottles. Allow to stand for 24
hours before using.

Waves Assured of Overseas Service

Overseas service for Waves is
assured if the present proposed
bill for permitting these members
of the women's reserve of the
navy is passed by congress, ac-
cording to Chief W. E. Bell, of
the Eugene navy recruiting sta-
tion, which handles Wave appli-
cations in this area. Observers in
Washington, D.C., predict that
congressional approval will be
given, Bell said.

The three main hurdles previ-
ously preventing assignment of
Waves to overseas duty have been
overcome, the proposal has been
approved by the house naval af-
fairs committee, the navy now has
real use for Waves at overseas
stations—an estimated 25,000 of
them to start with—and the plan
now has the popular approval of
both Waves and women's groups.

Summer recess of the senate
has caused a delay in considera-
tion of the bill. It was under
scrutiny by the senate naval af-
fairs committee with every assur-
ance of passing that group when
the session adjourned for the sum-
mer.

Every provision is made for the
maximum of protection, healthful
working and living conditions, and
safety of Waves who will serve
overseas in this measure, accord-
ing to Chief Bell.

Waves will have many new op-
portunities to travel and to enjoy
the adventure of living in foreign
lands when the Waves overseas
bill is passed—all this in addition
to the travel and training oppor-
tunities now given these young
women, said Bell.
