Al Zarilla's amazing hitting spree for a .854 average in the last seven Brownie games was accepted in baseball circles as one of the chief factors keeping the St. Louis Americans out in front in the junior loop flag chase despite the rush of Boston and Cleveland.

When Zarilla stepped into the lineup last Sunday to replace Lefty Chet Laabs, he was just another guy from Toledo, Friday night's three hits as the Browns thumped Philadelphia 8-5 upped his total to 17 in his last 26 at bats and boosted his all-season mark to .301.

Boston clubbed Detroit's Dizzy Trout for a lopsided 15-5 pasting Friday as Emmett O'Neill chalked up his third win. The Yanks split their set with Cleveland by taking a 13-7 verdict for Ernie Bonham's sixth straight victory. Nick Eiten and Johnny Lindell chipped in homers to help hand Al Smith his eighth loss.

Chicago got a neat 8-hit job by rookie Ed Lopat to trim Washington 8-2. Johnny Dickshot's bases-loaded triple off Lefty Lefebvre sparked a 5-run Chicago third inning.

Bill Voiselle of the New York Giants blanked Pittsburgh 4-0 for his 13th victory and first shutout to take over the strike out lead of the majors at 101.

Bob Chipman defeated his old Brooklyn mates for the second time as he hurled Chicago to a 4-1 edge with the help of some heavy clouting by Stan Hack and Ival Goodman. Philadelphia, Boston, St. Louis and Cincinnati were not scheduled in the National.

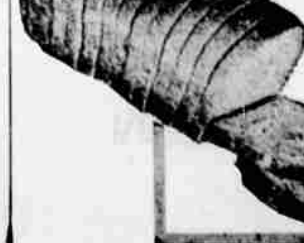
CLAUS DRAWS DREW

PORTLAND, July 29.—(P)—After 14 rounds of off-and-on slugging, Joe Kahut, Woodburn, Ore., exploded a series of right hands to Leo "The Lion" Turner's jaw Friday night to floor the Portland negro three times and retain his Oregon light-heavyweight championship with a technical knockout in the 15th.

The two battlers previously had fought to a pair of draws. Kahut, who built up a wide lead in the early going, outweighed Turner by 12½ pounds, 173 to 160½. Turner had one one good round, the eighth, when he kept the farm lad off balance with left jabs.

FT. MACARTHUR, Cal., July 29.—(P)—The University of Southern California's first-team "Reds" defeated the second-team "Whites" 31 to 6, in the annual intra-squad game winding up "spring" football practice Friday before the entire army personnel of Ft. MacArthur.

Veterans of the 1944 Rose Bowl game against Washington hogged the show, with Halfback Gordon Gray and Quarterback Jim Hardy getting off to long touchdown punts in the first quarter to give the Reds an early lead.

Gray rambled 84 yards for his first-quarter tally, and a short time later Hardy made his on a 74-yard run. Each scored once more, less spectacularly, later in the game.

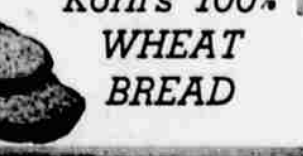
