National Woolgrowers Plan Salt Lake Meet

SALT LAKE CITY, Aug. 12.—The National Woolgrowers association today called a meeting of members for Aug. 20-23 in Salt Lake City, preceding the annual national ram sale.

"One thing the woolgrowers will want to know," said Secretary J. Melvon Jones, "is why the OPA is continuing to ration better cuts of lamb in the face of the downward trend in prices paid for live lambs and the large supply of spring lambs which will be moving to market in September and October."

Jones said the association and other organizations had repeatedly asked the OPA to lift lamb from the rationing list, but that no action has been taken.

NEW BOOKS

A Bell for Adano—John Hersey
Alfred A. Knopf, New York, 1944—\$2.50.

With American soldiers driving furiously toward Paris leaving scores of occupied French towns in their wake, this story of allied military government in an Italian town, one of the first to capitulate to our armed forces, becomes increasingly timely for Eugeneans to read.

Every Eugenean anxious about the peace should become acquainted with this story of the AMG (formerly AMGOT or Allied Military Government, occupied territory) for they will then have some inkling as to future allied successes or failures with European civilian populations.

Briefly, this story tells of the efforts of one AMG officer, Major Victor Joppolo, former grocer and city hall clerk, who strives to give an everyday meaning to that bawled word "democracy" for the townsfolk under his jurisdiction. No bureaucrat, he guides himself, not by theory, but by his own honest and good instincts and thereby hangs the tale.

There are few characters in the book who come close to his understanding of a foreign people. Some of the Americans responsible with him for civilian welfare are downright stupid, if not cruel. There's one general (you'll know him despite his fictitious name) whom most readers will condemn with the Italians as being an out-and-out "barbarian." It's the scarcity in the story of responsible Americans with sympathetic understanding of foreign customs and psychology (for the majority, the attitude toward their charges is "dirty dagoes") that is the one depressing note, and makes more urgent the warning Hersey put in his forward about the shape of the peace to come.

"Neither the eloquence of Churchill nor the humaneness of Roosevelt, no charter, no four freedoms or 14 points... can guarantee anything. Only men can guarantee, only the behavior of men under pressure, only our Joppolos."

Get to know this guy Joppolo and you'll agree with Hersey that "We have need of him," that "He is our future in the world."

In this first novel and third book of Life and Time War Correspondent John Hersey, the reader is given 269 pages of active simple prose that out-styles Ernie for its honest humanity. One of the best books (if not the best) about the war to date, it may be written in fiction form, but you know it's true, every word of it. And this guy Joppolo sticks. Get to know him.

Committee Plans To Inspect Truck Tires

PORTLAND, Aug. 12.—(AP)—Permission to inspect tires on "idle trucks and in stockpiles at ordnance depots in the north-west" was asked of the army by the newly organized Oregon Emergency Truck Tire committee yesterday.

The committee, claiming that some trucks were unused in north-west depots, telegraphed Lt. Gen. Brehon Somervell, chief of army service forces, that they wanted to determine if some tires might be released to ease the shortage in this area.

PORTLAND.—(AP)—The war food administration predicts that favorable weather in the next few weeks will assure the expected Oregon hop harvest of 87,000 bales.
