

Missionary From China Speaks Here

Rev. Stanton Lautenschlager of Chengtu, China, will come to Eugene to speak at Central Presbyterian church Wednesday evening, Oct. 11, at 7:30 p. m., it is announced. He has spent more than 20 years in work in China under the board of foreign missions of the Presbyterian church in the United States.

A Canadian, and graduate of Kitchener and Waterloo Collegiate Institute, Huntington College, Indiana, he took his master's degree at the University of Michigan. He was professor of modern history and sociology at Cheeloo university in Tsinan, China, and moved with the university to the interior city of Chengtu after enemy invasion. He lectured and preached in China's northwest, traveling by horseback and by plane; visited cities entirely within caves; was invited by communist leaders to return and build a church. During the recent four years of war, he was instrumental in bringing 6000 Chinese students to Christianity or its study, it is stated.

Church Notes

October 1 marks the beginning of a "Year of Dedication" at First Christian church and for the personal enrichment of individuals of the congregation. Pastor Walter J. The newly formed choir of the congregational church will make its first appearance at the worship service Sunday morning at 11 o'clock. It will be an all-girl choir made up of students and young people of the community. Under the capable direction of Miss Helen Luvass, only the finest of church music will be sung. Members were selected at an audition held last Tuesday evening. A waiting list will be maintained to allow the director to add to the membership as voices are needed. Rev. Mr. Nicholson will preach on the subject: "Bridges." The "College Fireside" will hold its meeting Sunday at 8 p. m. The planning committee has requested Mr. Nicholson to lead a discussion on "As We See Religion." The meeting will be after the manner of a "bull session," with an attempt to help the students bring into focus some of their ideas about religion.
