Getting More Consumer's Dollar

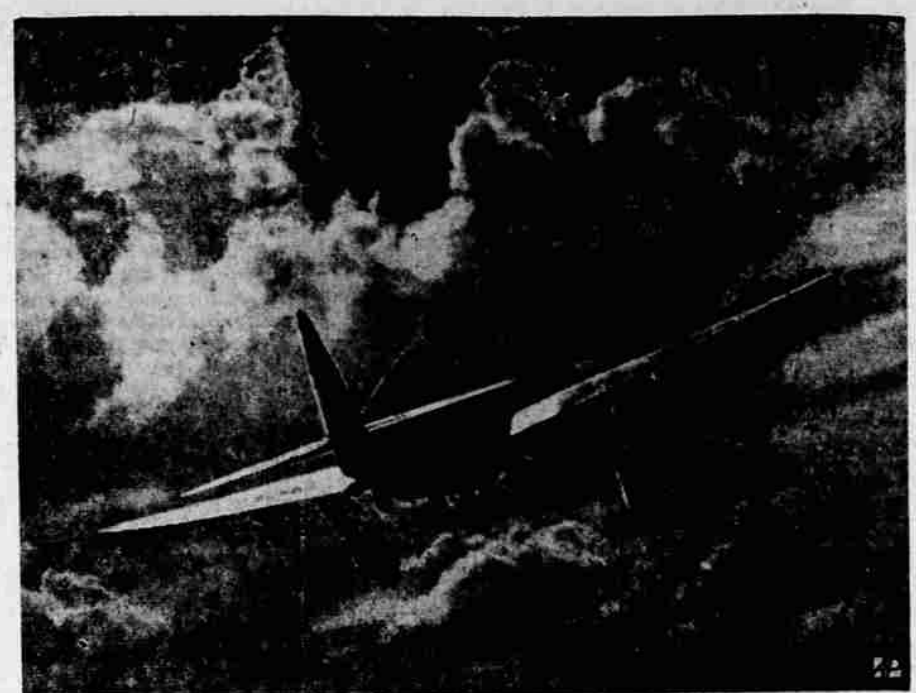

War Plant Prospectus Released By Jones

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Secretary of Commerce Jesse Jones has offered industry a prospectus for what, in the aggregate, will be one of the most gigantic real estate deals in all history — the sale of government-owned war plants to private industry. Jones issued what he called a "briefing" containing an advance listing of 973 plants and plant sites worth billions of dollars which are expected to be declared surplus after victory in the war. Of the total, 788 plants and sites are owned by the Defense Plant Corporation, and 94 by the war department. They are distributed all over the country. The government, Jones said, will negotiate now for their future sale or release.

The briefing was sent to banks, railroads, and chambers of commerce "so that these institutions will be in a position to advise and assist any of their customers who may be interested." "We are making every effort," Jones said, "to enable industry, both large and small, to purchase or lease the plants and to convert them to civilian production as quickly as possible after they are no longer needed for war purposes." In a letter to bankers, he added: "We have always stressed that we are not in competition with private lending institutions. However, we do stand ready to consider participating with you in loans that you may make in connection with financing the purchase or operation of these plants." Jones said the plants and facilities described in the briefing, with few exceptions, "are not now surplus but are being active."

Travel To Crater Lake Shows Increase In 1944

MEDFORD—(AP)—E. P. Leavitt, superintendent of Crater Lake National park released figures on the park's travel year which ended Sept. 30, showing 43,580 visitors entering in 9,396 motor vehicles. The visitation was a heavy increase over the previous season when 27,656 entered in 7,387 automobiles. Included in this season's visitor record were 14,834 men and women of the armed forces. This total compared with 6,392 the previous year.

Tests Are Guide On Post-Graduate Work

The University of Oregon has been designated by the Carnegie foundation for the advancement of teaching as a center for graduate record examinations. Dr. H. R. Taylor, associate dean of the graduate division, announces.

Purposes of the examination is to discover which students have genuine promise and capabilities for graduate study. Heretofore many people have spent perhaps three years' time and money doing graduate work, only to fail at the end because they are not equipped for it.

This was brought out in a survey made by the Carnegie foundation to determine the actual grasp sophomores and graduates have obtained of material they have been studying. It was found that not every good student, no matter how high his grades, has the same mastery of the subjects taken or has potentialities for graduate work. A series of tests was developed by the Carnegie foundation to show the nature and extent of a student's actual equipment in knowledge and have been tried out for a number of years in 10 graduate institutions. Later about 40 liberal arts colleges used them and the results indicate that the examination has advantages which should be made available to students generally, it is said.

Through the auspices of the Carnegie foundation the examination may be taken for a fee of \$3. Returning soldiers will find the tests particularly useful too, to appraise their attainment and ability, before continuing with previous plans for professional study or graduate work, it is pointed out.

Dr. Taylor and Dr. Leona Tyler, assistant professor of psychology, will administer the examinations at Oregon, probably twice a year. Oregon will not require the tests before graduate work can be taken but will advise that students take advantage of them.
