Market Reports

By HORACE BURNETT, Market Editor. EUGENE Produce prices in the Eugene markets were steady and unchanged Saturday, with offerings of all seasonal fruits and vegetables plentiful. At the public market tomatoes were still coming in, the weather during the growing season being excellent for continuous ripening of this crop. They were selling at 10 cents a pound. Wax beans were still on hand, the price being quoted at 15 cents a pound and there were on hand rhubarb at 10 cents a pound; lettuce, 15 cents a head; cabbage, 7 cents a pound; corn, 40 cents a dozen ears. In the fruit line there was a good supply of apples, Grimes Golden, Jonathan, Spitzenberg, and Gravenstein predominating. The price ranged from \$1.75 to \$2.40 a bushel. Grapes were seen in large quantities
