

Community Day Is Held At Church

World Community day will be observed Friday, Nov. 3, by church women of the nation, and the observance in Eugene will be held Friday at 2 p. m. at First Congregational church.

The day has been set aside, it is stated, so that church women may assemble to reflect upon problems facing the world today. Like the World Day of Prayer held recently, it is sponsored by the Council of Church Women. Practically every church in the city is represented at the Eugene council by two delegates each.

Mrs. C. A. Horton is program chairman for Friday, for the local council. Rev. Wesley Goodson Nicholson will be the speaker, on the topic: "Racial Relationships." Special music will be provided, Mrs. Kenneth Johnston will lead devotions. All church women of the city are urged to attend.
