4-H Clubs Observe Achievement Week

This week is national achievement week and reorganization week among the 4-H clubs and club members all over the United States are taking part in some 4-H club activity. In Lane county the clubs are well on their way in their 1945 program and up to Saturday noon enrollments for 50 clubs with membership of 722 had been reported to the office of E. A. Danielson, county leader.

The new club year started Nov. 1. It does not follow the calendar year, but runs from Nov. 1 to October 31, inclusive. The reason for this is that it gives time to prepare the county report so that the report for the

state can be prepared by Jan. 1, Danielson explains.

"For that reason we are interested in completions of club work for those members enrolled during this last year," Danielson said. "We already have approximately 2,330 record books turned in and we also have several club members who have not as yet turned in record books. I realize that several of them are in the hands of the leaders. I am referring particularly to projects that were carried this summer—garden, canning and livestock. Most of the others with the exception of a few, were turned in by April 29, although there are a few of those that still should come in. If we get these record books some time during this month, then we can use them in our county report. We hope that our county report for completions will be as good as it has in the past."

All club members who were enrolled last year and completed their work and turned in their record books will receive either a 4-H achievement pin or an achievement certificate, depending upon which year of club work is being finished. The first year award is a bronze pin; second year, a certificate; third year, a silver pin with a green 4-leaf clover emblem on it; 4th year, a certificate; and 5th year, a gold pin with a 4-leaf clover on it. Certificates are given for the sixth, seventh, eighth, and ninth year of completion.

Up to this year, certificates were awarded for the tenth year of completions, but this year Danielson is announcing for the first time in the history of club work in Oregon that members who have completed 10 years of their work will receive ten-year pins. H. C. Seymour, state club leader, told the Lane county leader about these pins at conference at the state college last week and said that he did not know of any other state having a pin for the tenth year club members.

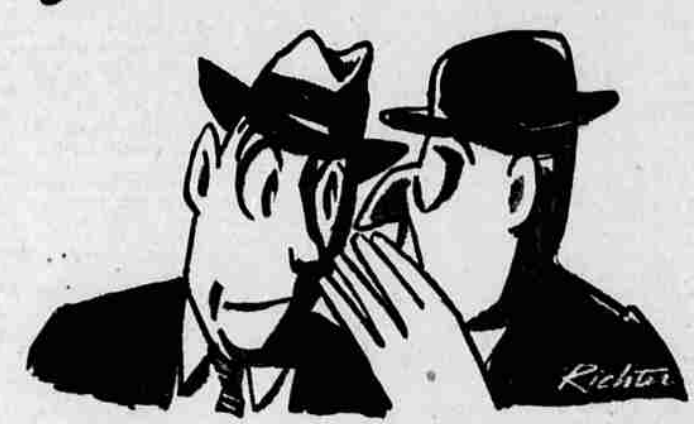

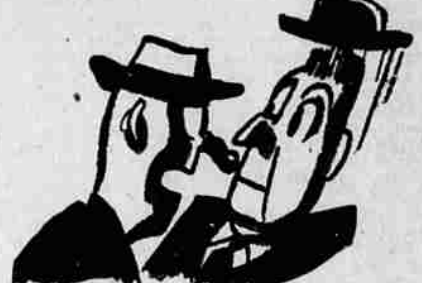
