

Schmitz Wizard Of Technical Artistry, Reviewer Declares

It was a rare pleasure for a Eugene audience to hear E. Robert Schmitz, internationally known pianist, in concert Tuesday evening. Mr. Schmitz gave a matchless performance, proving himself artistically tempered with musical understanding.

Considered as one of Chopin's technically most difficult compositions is the "Sonata in B minor, Opus 58." Mr. Schmitz in his performance of this number played with full virtuosity. The pianist, as a true interpreter, gave to the listeners the fullest conception of the composer's various moods of the composition, from the symphonic themes of the first movement to the whirling rondo form of the finale.

The artist probably captured his listeners more completely through his interpretation of the works of the French impressionist composer, Debussy. His delightful touch in rhythm and tone in the "Golliwog's Cake Walk" of this composer was a highlight of the recital. As a listener, I never again, unless to hear it played again by Mr. Schmitz, expect to hear the Debussy "Clair de lune" played with such grace and charm of atmosphere. In hearing the pianist on this evening perform some of the better known Debussy numbers listeners probably came closer to hearing these compositions as the composer himself would have wanted them played than at any other time. Mr. Schmitz was fortunate enough to have at his command the personal interpretation of the composer, having been a friend of Debussy's before the latter's death in 1918.

In great contrast to the artist's first number, the "Prelude and Fugue in G minor" of Bach, was another work of the same master of writing brilliancy, "Prelude and Fugue in A minor." The strength and dexterity of counterpoint in the playing of this composition by Mr. Schmitz gave it the right to be called a "brilliant performance" in interpretation and technical artistry.

Perfect finger dexterity was greatly shown on a whole throughout the entire program but the smoothness and evenness of quality was especially noticeable in the rapid running passages; such as in the lovely Chopin "Waltz in C-sharp minor."

British Push Toward Faenza In Italy

ROME, Nov. 15.—(AP)—British troops of the 8th army battled through increasing German opposition today to reach within five and a half miles of Faenza, the next important junction point on the main highway to Bologna.

North of the highway, one British force was advancing west from Saint Torne, two miles northwest of captured Forlì, while other units crossed the Montone river, with patrols reaching the side of the road three and a half miles west of Forlì.

The southern British forces also cleared Mount Poggiolo, four miles southwest of Forlì, and occupied the village of Villagrande, a mile to the north.

Indian troops, operating on the right flank of the 5th army front, also were driving toward the Bologna highway and captured Mount San Bartolo to gain an observation point on German-held Modigliani, 10 miles southwest of Faenza.

In the Adriatic sector, 8th army troops still were fighting in the pine woods southeast of Ravenna. Headquarters disclosed that one patrol entered an enemy house in the Ravenna area and captured one German still in bed and five eating breakfast.

Emma Lauretta Stevens

MCKENZIE BRIDGE—Mrs. Emma Lauretta Stevens, 90, a resident of this community for the past 20 years, died at her home here Tuesday. She was born July 9, 1854 in the township of Rae, Mich., and was married to Martin L. Stevens at Holton, Mich., May 18, 1872. They came west in 1899, living first in Los Angeles and then at Looking Glass, Ore. Mr. Stevens died in 1928.

'Damask Cheek' Cast In Dress Rehearsals

Extra dress rehearsals have been held this week for the cast of "The Damask Cheek," Very Little Theater production, which will open Thursday at the VLT show-house for a three-night run. The extra sessions were necessary to allow players to become accustomed to their own costumes and those around them. Not only must they adopt the erect carriage occasioned by nipped-in waists and boned high collars, but must learn to manage trailing skirts, and to avoid tripping over long pointed toes of shoes. They also must get all their laughter over in advance.

High collars are not restricted to the feminine members of the cast, but are part of masculine attire as well, and stiff-bosomed shirts along with them.

One item of the fashions of 1909 which has already returned is the "pompadour" style of hairdress; in this respect, audience will resemble cast in many costumes. However, use of jeweled combs of the era will be a period touch.

One of the interesting characters of the production is Calla, the tarnished actress—although harping off upon the theme of her main-tained virtue. Calla, played by Mary Staton Krenk, actually smokes, a thing no lady did in 1909.

Kay Korn, last seen as the bored and sophisticated Russian actress in the VLT's "Dark Eyes" and her finished performance in "Dark Victory," University of Oregon presentation, plays an enigmatic part in this one, as an 18-year-old girl fascinated by an older man.

A fairly heavy accumulation of selling orders put a dent in prices at the opening. The general tone was irregular near the close. Transactions amounted to around 900,000 shares. Among pivotal shares at slightly better levels in the final hour were Douglas Aircraft, Boeing, Westinghouse, Allied Chemical, Youngstown Sheet, Johnson & Johnson, and International Nickel. The curb was soft with losses recorded by Childs Co. preferred, Cuban-American Sugar, United Gas, American Gas & Electric and International Petroleum. Bonds conformed to the downward trend.
