Widow Of Pioneer Merchant Dies

Mrs. Adeline Greene Church, 94, widow of John C. Church, who came to Eugene City in 1872 and was one of its pioneer business men, died Monday at the home of a son, Curtis H. Church, in Seattle. She was a native of Kentucky, born in Richmond county, the youngest of a family of seven. Her father was a farmer.

She was married to John Church in Macon, Mo., Nov. 16, 1869. He had served with the Second Iowa regiment of cavalry during the civil war, rising to rank of second lieutenant in four years. He had located in Macon soon after the close of the war. They remained there three years after their marriage, then came west.

In connection with J. F. Robinson, Mr. Church established a hardware store in Eugene, the firm name being Robinson and Church, and the store situated on Willamette near Eighth, a part of the present site of the U. S. National bank. Later, he disposed of his interests in the store, and engaged in the business of the Eugene Electric Light company, of which he was the president. They were influential citizens of the city. In 1897, Mr. Church was killed by a fall from the roof of the light plant building, which was under construction. Mrs. Church and their four children continued to live in Eugene for a number of years. Later she moved to Tacoma, to make her home with her eldest son, Lee Wirt Church, until his death.

Surviving are two sons, Earl H. Church and Curtis H. Church, both of Seattle, and one daughter, Mrs. Ermine Church Fields, whose home is in California. Services are to be held in Eugene at the Veatch-Hollingsworth mortuary, Thursday at 10:30 a.m., with interment in the Masonic cemetery. Rev. Llewellyn O. Griffith of First Methodist church will officiate.

Mrs. Mary G. Gibson
CRESWELL—Mrs. Mary Genevra Gibson, 88, died Tuesday at the home of her sons, Tracy and Bert Gibson, near Creswell. She was born in Wisconsin, Oct. 2, 1856, and was a member of the Methodist church. She had lived in this community for the past three years.

He left Eugene in December, 1942, to enter a war industry in Vancouver. Prior to that time, he had made his home for six years in Eugene. He was born Dec. 3, 1894, in Grandin, N. D., and served in World War I in the 322nd field signal battalion.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Mary Peckham of Vancouver; two sons, George M. Peckham, AMM 1-c, and Russell E. Peckham, S 1-c, both in the U. S. navy; a granddaughter, Diana Lee Peckham of Portland; a brother, George R. Peckham of Eugene. George Peckham came by plane from Rhode Island to attend the services, and his wife, Wilma A. Peckham, S 1-c in the Waves, joined her husband there, coming by plane from San Pedro. The other son is in the south Pacific, his wife in Portland.

Cottage Grove Man Held For Grand Jury

Fred Annett, Cottage Grove, charged with alteration of a certificate of title of a motor vehicle, was given a preliminary hearing in the Eugene justice court Tuesday afternoon and was bound over to the grand jury with bail fixed at \$500.

Mills, Springfield, testified that the defendant owed her \$180 on the purchase price of a car and that after she had written on the certificate of title that there was a \$180 lien on the car and had delivered it to him, he erased the lien clause from the instrument. Annett testified that he did erase the words, claiming that Mrs. Mills had no right to have written them on the certificate.
