Food Production Soars 36 Per Cent

PORTLAND, ORE., (U.P.)—G. F. Geissler, western division director for the agricultural adjustment administration, declared that despite a shortage of labor and needed farm equipment, Oregon farmers along with those throughout the nation this year produced 36 per cent more food than was produced last year.

"This year's farm front food production total is on all time high and 35 per cent above the five year average for the 1935-1939," Geissler said. "The surprising thing is that there are 17 per cent less men, women and children on farms than there were during any year of that period."

The AAA official explained that the WFA wants the same acreage of crops next year, the same number of livestock as this year but more dairy products.

A friend who had seen Ethyl Barrymore play the role of Miss Moffatt in "The Corn Is Green" remarked the other day that any other woman who took on the job, whether amateur or professional, would suffer by comparison. She based this statement upon the weight which the part carries and its importance in motivating the play's action.

As Miss Moffatt, Dortha Thomas last night certainly gave the part the vitality which it requires as she headed an excellent cast in their first performance by the University Theatre of the Broadway success by Emyln Williams.

Fumbling infrequently, as first-night performers will do, the group nevertheless held audience interest throughout the three acts of the drama which tells of the efforts of an educated, middle-aged lady to school a group of illiterate Welsh coal miners. The interest which she takes in one young man with particular talents, and the struggle which she goes through to help him escape the influence of his environment form the basis of the plot.

David T. Shay as the young miner gives a creditable performance, but is outstanding in only one scene, the first of Act II, during which he gives a few lines an extremely fine treatment. John Moore as The Squire is entertaining with his brusque humor. Estelle Shimshack is excellent as a girl of rather questionable character.

The cast as a whole handles the matter in a rather routine way, achieving polish only during the first scene of Act II. However, audience's who see the play tonight or December 6 or 7 will undoubtedly witness the polished performances of which glimpses were caught opening night.
