

Food For Nazis, Eisenhower

The Associated Press
Eisenhower has bluntly
stated the German people
cannot count upon food,
clothing from the mili-
tary government, and must rely
on their own resources.

"Food supplies, seeds, fertilizers
and agricultural machines must
be salvaged above all," Eisen-
hower said, "if hunger is not to
follow the defeat. German farm-
ers must by all possible means
prevent the nazis from driving
away their cattle as the allied
armies advance. They must do
everything in their power to keep
their farms in order and to achieve
peak production."

Eisenhower warned the peo-
ple of the reich that "the hopes
of the German people to avoid
economic collapse after the defeat
are largely dependent upon the
extent of German opposition to
nazi plans to destroy German
property and German natural re-
sources before the occupation by
allied troops."

Cigaret Overcharge
Penalties Assessed

PORTLAND, Dec. 6.—(AP)—Ac-
cused of overcharging on cigaret
sales, two Portland concerns have
made settlements to the OPA,
Spencer W. Yates, enforcement at-
torney, said today.

An OPA treble damage claim
for \$300 was settled by S. G. Mar-
rett, concessionaire at the recent
Portland open golf tournament,
and one for \$89.80 was settled
by M. Shipstad, Portland ice arena,
Yates stated.

Marrett was charged with sell-
ing 110,000 cigarettes at as high as
\$2 a carton and 25 cents a pack-
age, and Shipstad with selling
packs at four cents above ceiling
price, according to Yates.
