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Declining Butter Output Forecast

CHICAGO—(U.P.)—Butter production will continue its downward trend unless there is an immediate adjustment of price controls and subsidy payments, according to E. J. Ryger, manager of the Mid-

west Producers' Creameries, Inc., of South Bend, Ind. Ryger, addressing American Farm Bureau federation delegates at a dairy conference, asserted that subsidy payments do not adjust the price of butter sufficiently to make its production worth while. The price the farmer receives for his product, including the subsidy, does not compare favorably

with the price of fluid milk and other dairy products, Ryger told the group.

"For this reason, it has not been attractive to dairy producers receiving whole milk to churn the butterfat into butter when they can sell it as sweet cream or in the form of other products which command higher prices," he said.

O & C Bill Action This Session Unlikely

WASHINGTON, Dec. 13—(U.P.)—Rep. Harris Ellsworth, (R-Ore.), said house action was unlikely at this session on his bill to make the department of the interior sole administrator of the 1,500,000 acres of the so-called Oregon and California land grant.

If the house should meet next week, Ellsworth said, there was a "slim chance" that his bill might again come up for consideration. The legislation settles an old controversy between the interior department and the agriculture department's forest service over administration of the 460,000 forested acres of the land grant. The bill was brought up on the floor Monday but immediate passage

was blocked by Rep. John Cochran, (D-Mo.).

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
