

tion's Wage is New High

WASHINGTON, Dec. 28—(AP)—National income rose to a new high of \$159,000,000,000 in 1944, while U. S. production reached a new peak of \$197,000,000,000, the department of commerce reported today.

The wartime peak of economic activity was reached this year, the department said, pointing out that national income increased five per cent over 1943, compared to a rise of 23 per cent in 1942.

Leveling of business in 1944 due to stabilization of war phases, the department said, war expenditures were up 10 per cent from last year.

Consumers bought \$97,000,000,000 in goods and services, six per cent more than in 1943. Personal income was substantially larger a year, but absorbed only 15 per cent of total income payments.

In spite of higher taxes and war expenditures, individual savings were expected to reach an all-time high of more than \$36,000,000,000.

The OPA helped the mayor crack a hard nut in civic purity: it helped him restore the Port-

land gypsy community to its original state, of a wandering tribe.

Anyway, several dozen of them bundled themselves into their jalopies this afternoon and set forth, threatened by prosecution should they use their gasoline rations for any purpose other than remembering the Alamo.
