

Churchmen Take Part In Local Rally

A promotional rally Sunday will be the occasion for the coming of Rev. Paul P. Petticoard and Rev. C. P. Gates of Portland, district superintendents of the Oregon Evangelical conference of the Evangelical church of Eugene, Eighth and Monroe streets.

The day's rally will start with the morning worship service at 11 a. m., when one of the superintendents will preach the sermon. At 2:30 p. m., a session promoting the interests of evangelism, Christian education and stewardship will be presented, featuring the tri-color projector for visual education in these subjects.

Full term registrations for veterans totaled 76. Of these, 15 failed to return for winter term. Forty-two new veterans signed up for classes the week of Jan. 2. Total registration for fall and winter term is 118, Dean Virgil D. Earl, dean of men and administrative officer in charge of the veterans, announces.
