First Post-War Tax Relief Seen For Individuals

WASHINGTON, (AP)—Income tax paying individuals and consumers in general will get post-war tax relief ahead of corporations, it appears if federal reserve board views accurately reflect President Roosevelt's intentions.

The president's budget message warned that there could be no tax relief while we are engaged in major war. He said only minor adjustment could be made after there had been major cuts in war expenditures.

1. Drastic reduction in excise taxes. 2. Reduction of personal income taxes on lower income groups.

These should come first. Eccles believes, and continues: "Once this has been done and revenue needs permit, I would favor a reduction in the corporation income tax. The rate might be lowered to 25 or 30 per cent and the corporation permitted to take out of its taxable income that part of its profits which it distributes as dividends."

"This would remove double taxation of dividends, under the corporation income tax, and would be an inducement for corporations to distribute their earnings. The excess profits tax with its carry-over and carry-back provisions should be retained for some time after the war at a reduced rate of around 65 per cent."

Oregonian Arrives In East For Trial In 40-Year-Old Slaying

CHICAGO, Jan. 13.—(AP)—Benjamin Franklin Male, 73, arrived today on his long journey home to his beloved West Virginia hills—where he must face an indictment for a 40-year-old murder.

Male, who is returning voluntarily from St. Helena, Ore., to be tried for the 1903 slaying of Walter O. Smith at Hault, W. Va., hobbled from the train with the help of a cane.

"I wouldn't do it again if I had a chance; I'd run first. But I've never thought of it as a sin—I didn't mean to kill."

Male allegedly beat Smith to death with a hoe during an argument after the school teacher severely disciplined Male's son. Criminal Court Judge Charles W. Miller said Male's trial will be held Saturday if he pleads guilty immediately upon his arrival.

Otherwise the trial will be set tentatively for Jan. 22. Male had been living in Oregon for the past 30 years. Several months ago he confessed that he was wanted on a murder charge in Marion county, W. Va.

Need For More Farm Workers Stressed

CORVALLIS, Jan. 13.—(AP)—Oregon farmers will need even more volunteer women and children workers this summer than last, county farm labor assistants agreed today.

J. R. Beck, state farm labor supervisor, warned of an impending decline in farm manpower through stricter draft regulations and a possible cut in the number of Mexican importees.

Farm labor assistants from 16 counties urged expansion of last year's "live-in" program—placing teen-age boys on specified farms to work throughout the summer.
