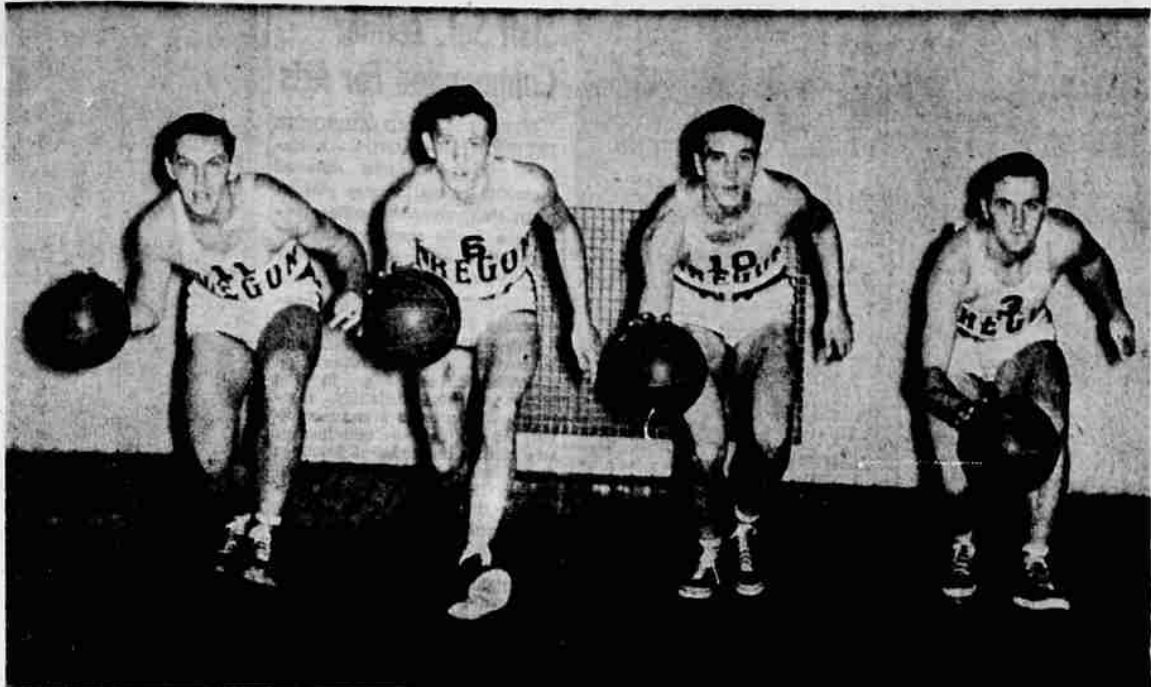

Bowlers To Battle For Rich Awards

CHICAGO, Jan. 17.—Two thousand bowlers, lured from 24 states and Canada by a total of \$82,400 in cash prizes, will gather in Chicago next weekend to make this city the world's bowling capital.

For 16 days most of the nation's top bowlers, the majority of them competing in all three tournaments, will batter the maples in one of bowling's richest get-togethers.

Chief prizes will be the \$5,100 cash and the diamond-studded gold medal offered the winner of the Louis P. Petersen individual tournament.

All entrants have to qualify with an average of 185 or better in a recognized league.
