 hold meetings Feb. 21, 22 and 23.**

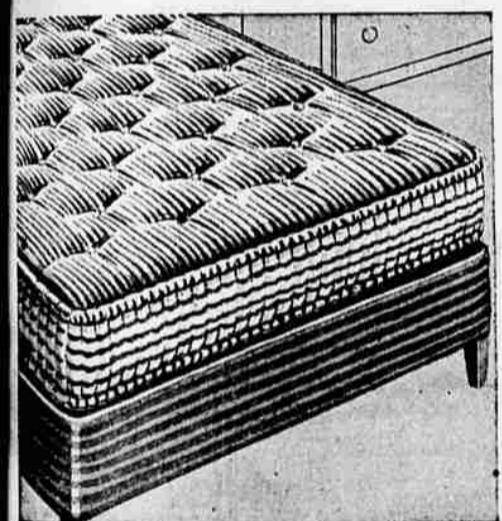
**Eugene Gleemen are to sing

 his home needs repairs, he said.

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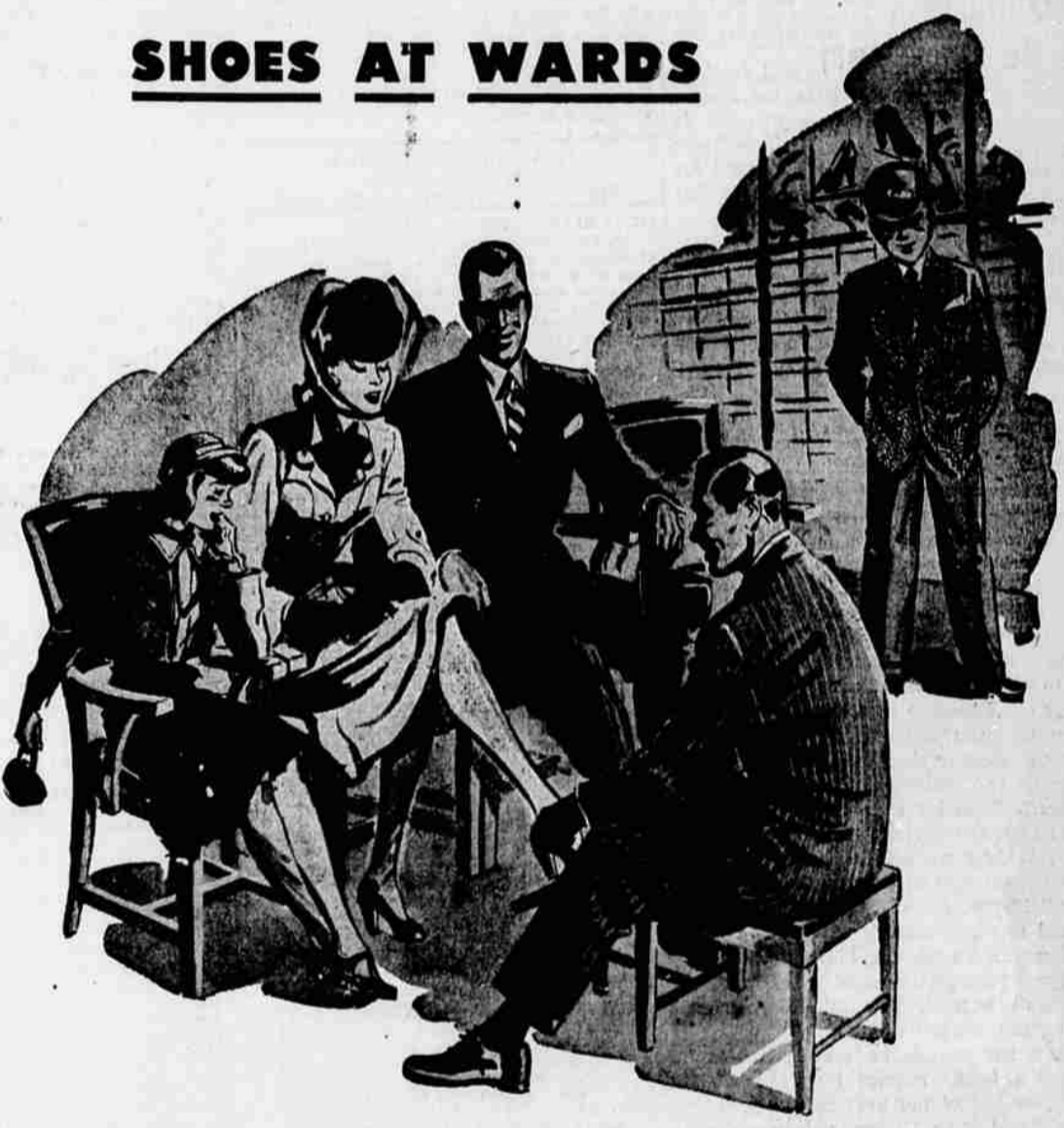

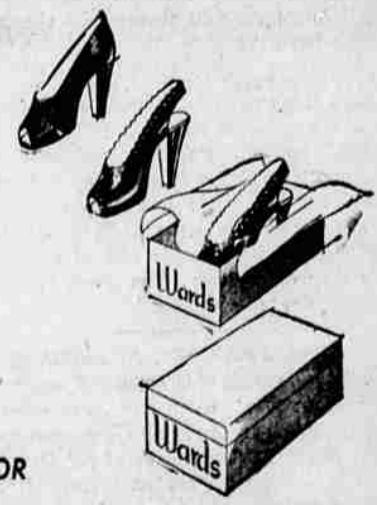
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
