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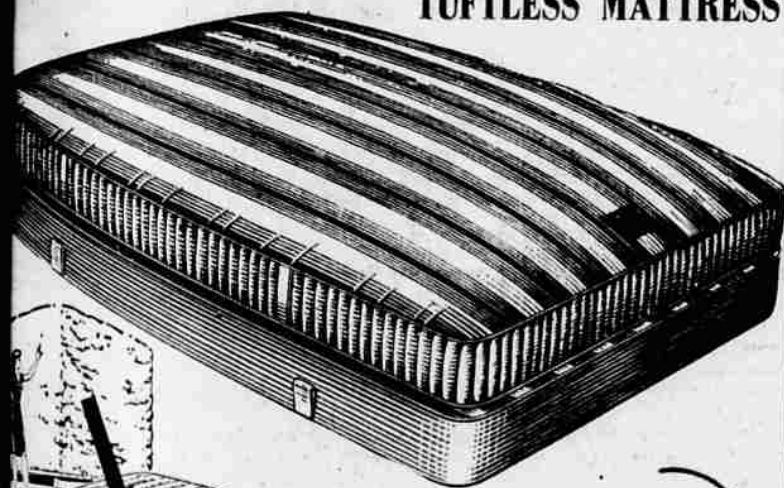

Details On Silver Star Award To Ray Winther Received From Pacific

SOMEWHERE IN THE NETH-
ERLANDS EAST INDIES: Medi-
cal corpsmen in a unit attached
to the "Sunset" or 41st infantry
division, Sgt. Ray S. Winther of
86 Grand street, Eugene, recently
has been distinguished by the
award of the silver star for "gal-
lantry in action" during the battle
for Wakde island. At the time of
the citation he was a technician
fifth grade and since has been pro-
moted. His citation read:

"Technician Grade Five Ray-
mond S. Winther, medical depart-
ment, United States army. Decora-
tion, silver star. For gallantry in
action at Wakde island on 15 May,
1944. During the phase of the
Wakde island operations when
preparations were in progress to
fire a barrage from Insoemai
island onto Insoemai island, prior
to landing on Insoemai by our
troops, the enemy opened fire from
across the intervening channel
wounding four men and pinning
all personnel to the ground. At the
call for an aid man, Technician
Grade Five Winther moved at con-
siderable risk to himself to aid the
wounded men, and despite con-
tinued fire from the enemy, assisted
them to cover and rendered
first aid. The saving of the lives
of two of the wounded men can be
credited to Technician Winther's
courageous action."

Sergeant Winther has been serv-
ing in the southwest Pacific the-
atre of war since March, 1942, and
has been through the Buna-San-
ananda campaign in which his
regiment was awarded the presi-
dential citation badge. He since
has participated in the Toem,
Wakde island and Biak island
campaigns. While his unit was sta-
tioned in Australia he was able to
visit Melbourne, Sydney, Bris-
bane, Perth and Tasmania. He en-
tered the army in September 1940
and subsequently was stationed at
Fort Lewis, Washington and Hun-
ter-Liggett, California. He served
first with the Oregon national
guard and before coming overseas
was transferred to the Montana
guard regiment in the 41st infan-
try division.

He has four cousins also in the
service, representing the army,
navy and "seabees."

Sergeant Winther attended school
in Eugene and prior to entry into
the army did construction work
with the Mountain States Con-
struction company. He is the son
of Mr. and Mrs. Anton Winther
of Eugene.

Private Haynes Takes Radio School Course
