Climatic Charts
Shown At Lecture

The striking similarity between the climate of Tokyo, Japan, and that of Washington, D. C., is brought out in a series of climatic charts of "War Fronts of the World," recently compiled by Willis B. Merriam, assistant professor of geology at the University of Oregon, for his class in regional geography. Data for the charts was largely obtained from the Smithsonian institution of Washington, D. C.

Tokyo, in the monsoon region, averages 60 inches of rain per year, with an average temperature of 37 degrees in Jan. to 80 degrees in August. This gives cool, humid winters and hot and very damp or humid summers. Almost the same as the figures for the climate of Washington, D. C., it differs considerably from Eugene's 38.2 inches of rainfall per year, with a temperature averaging from 38 degrees in January to 53 degrees in August. Charted together, these figures give Eugene a cool, damp ten months of the year with July and August warm and dry.

In contrast, Singapore, typical tropical rain forest region like that of nearly all of the south Pacific, registers 92.8 inches of rain each year with a temperature ranging from 78 to 81 degrees every month. The rain in Singapore is evenly spaced throughout the year, also, each month averaging from 6 to 11 inches, resulting in a hot and very humid climate the entire year.

Berlin comes closest of all war fronts to an ideal climate with 22.9 inches of rain evenly distributed throughout the year and a temperature averaging from 32 to 64 degrees. This means considerable snow but a general climate ranging from cold to warm.

Typical of the Burma war theater is Akyab with the winter months showing an average of one or two inches of rain and the

month of June alone averaging 54 inches. Total rainfall average for the year is 203.8 inches which, with a temperature ranging from 70 to 85 degrees results in a hot and saturatingly wet climate most of the year.

The entire group of climatic charts will be included in the exhibits to be shown at the open house of the Eugene Natural History society, following their lecture by Dr. John C. Merriam on Friday evening, Feb. 23.
