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County Stockmen Act On Problems

Livestock producers of Lane county took action on a number of questions of interest to the industry, elected officers and directors and listened to a program of moving pictures and talks at the annual meeting of the Lane County Livestock association, held in the 4-H club building on the county fairground Friday.

There was an attendance of 52 at the meeting. Principal action taken at the business session of the gathering follows:

1. Voted to ask the county court for emergency funds to employ an additional predatory animal hunter at once.
2. Voted to ask the state game commission for funds to help support the predatory animal work in the county.
3. Voted to ask the county budget committee to provide funds in the budget to be made up this spring for the year beginning July 1 for an additional hunter.
4. Adopted a resolution commending the state legislature for its action in killing the proposed bill which would increase the tax on REA co-operatives.

The association elected as directors for the two-year term Chester A. Chase, Springfield RFD 1; F. W. Mahony, Junction City RFD 1, and Allen P. Wheeler, Creswell RFD 1. The directors then re-elected all officers who are as follows: president, Fred G. Knox, Eugene RFD 2; vice-president, F. W. Mahony, Junction City RFD 1; secretary, O. S. Fletcher, Eugene; treasurer, Charles Page, Fall Creek.

Fletcher; remarks by R. G. Johnson, head of the animal husbandry department, Oregon State college; "Livestock Situation and Outlook," by H. A. Lindgren, livestock specialist at the college; "Livestock Diseases," by Dr. J. N. Shaw, head of the department of veterinary medicine at the college.

Seed Certification

Thursday, March 1, is the final date for applying for certification of Willamette vetch seed. It has been announced by the Oregon seed certification board. O. S. Fletcher, county agent, is sending a letter to every farmer in Lane county known to have purchased certified Willamette vetch seed last year, containing a copy of the rules for certification. Remittance to cover acreage fee should accompany the application for certification, the county agent says. The charge is five cents per acre, with a minimum charge of \$1 and a maximum of \$5.

The county agent is calling growers' attention that there are two grades this year that will qualify for the government price of six cents per pound. One is "certified seed" and the other is "foundation seed." Foundation seed corresponds to certified seed of former years while "certified seed" is not quite so good seed, but will be accepted by the government for cover crop purposes.
