

Merit System Jobs Open To Graduates

The merit system council, under its program of continuous recruitment, is making possible immediate employment of high school and college students upon graduation this spring. Examinations will be given approximately April 14, 1945, for the clerical, case-work, and telephone operator positions in the state unemployment compensation commission, public welfare commissions, state and county boards of health, and the crippled children's division of the University of Oregon medical school.

At that time all prospective graduates will be admitted if otherwise qualified. The examinations will have been graded and the appointments can be made immediately upon graduation.

Also included in this series will be an examination for the position of administrative secretary. This position requires high school graduation and five years of stenographic experience.

Appointments under the merit system have such desirable attributes as tenure, paid vacation, and sick leave periods, and protected employment conditions. Career service is encouraged through the policy of promotion within the agency for satisfactory and ambitious employees.

Speeding Fines Levied In Municipal Court

Three speeding fines and one for backing a car against traffic were imposed by Municipal Judge Stanley R. Darling Monday afternoon.

The speeding fines: Kilburn Foot, 40 miles in a 25-mile zone, \$7.50. Judge Darling said evidence showed Foot's previous record in traffic observation good.

He said the area where the cars were parked had not been checked regularly, but that he would post notices in his plant that it is to be checked and parking limits enforced. The court ordered a fine of \$8, and suspended \$4 in view of the evidence.

RC Greets Liberees

The American Red Cross cañeen at the docks was very busy when prisoners liberated at Cabanatuan arrived recently at San Francisco to go into Letterman hospital.

Red Cross workers were on hand to pass out milk for the men and other comforts. Among those treated was Major Robert E. Sly of Eugene, who also expressed appreciation for Red Cross food packages he received while interned. "The first Red Cross package I received came on Jan. 28, 1943, and was that a welcome sight!" Major Sly is quoted as telling the Red Cross workers at the docks. Major Sly explained that the average distribution of food parcels to prisoners at Cabanatuan in 1943 was one American Red Cross package per each two men, one Canadian Red Cross package per each two men, and one British South American Red Cross package per man.

Sly's first act, like most of the other liberees, was to send a Red Cross telegram home to his mother in Eugene announcing his arrival in the states, the officials report.

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Gillilan Joins Navy

James P. Gillilan, 17, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles L. Gillilan, 2069 Olive street, Eugene, was sworn into the U. S. navy at Portland this week as seaman 1-c, radio technician, after passing the Eddy radar test. After boot training he will take an intensive 10-month's course in radar training. The course includes six weeks' training in radio material; three months of primary and six months of secondary training. Upon successful completion of the course, Gillilan will be subject to assignment with the naval air forces, with the fleet or on shore duty. Radar technicians can graduate from any one of the several schools in the United States with a rating of petty officer.

The radar training program is

now open to men between the ages of 17 and 50, inclusive, and for those who can qualify by passing the Eddy test, the way is open for free training in the new field of electronics.

The navy recruiting office in Eugene is in the U. S. post office building on Willamette street and is manned by Chief W. E. Bell and Walter F. Patric, specialist 1-c.
