

## Unemployment Up Here After Flood

Unemployment did not rise in December in Lane county, but it has been rising sharply following the recent flood.

This was disclosed Wednesday in release of figures by the USES here, showing about a 49 per cent increase in persons seeking assistance.

## Clarence Nelson Dies In PW Camp

Captain Clarence Nain Nelson, former Eugene resident and a graduate of the University of Oregon, died Sept. 5, 1945 in Tan Toey prisoner of war camp at Ambon, Netherlands East Indies, according to word received here by his mother, Mrs. Peter Nelson, of 1370 Emerald street, and his sister, Mrs. Alma Thompson, 1805 Pearl street.

Captain Nelson was a geologist in Manila when the war broke out, and fought with the guerilla forces the first year, being commissioned as a captain. He was captured by the Japanese during an attempted escape from the Philippines to Australia in a two-masted sail boat, with 13 other Americans. Adverse winds were blamed for the capture.

The next three years Captain Nelson and his companions spent in the prisoner of war camp, but due to malnutrition, and complications, only eight survived. His family had received no word

of him since 1941, until the news of his death reached them.

Besides his mother and sister, Captain Nelson is survived by a daughter, Gladys Nelson, now living in Los Angeles, and a brother, Richard M. Nelson, a graduate of the University of Oregon and now working as a geologist in Sumatra.

## J. J. Metz Buys Red Cross Drug Store

Mrs. Mae Paris has sold the Red Cross drug store at 68 West Broadway to James J. Metz of Eugene, who took charge of the business Tuesday.

Mrs. Paris had conducted the store the past four and a half years, taking charge after the death of her husband, A. R. Paris, who had owned and operated it since 1922.

Charles Rickabaugh, who has been employed as pharmacist at the store for some time past, will continue in that capacity under the new management.
