It was just one of those things—an unforeseen happening. The Junction City Tigers came to McArthur court Tuesday night all set for a victory over the supposedly hapless University High Golden Tigers. The Tigers happened to be colder than last night's gray and the Golden Tigers—they had that hoop bored—were hitting from all angles. The final score was 48-26 with Uni high on the long end for its first District Six victory.

The Tigers appeared jittery. Perhaps the unfamiliar wide open spaces at the university pavilion put them off stride. It was probably their worst showing of the season and unfortunately for them it came on a night when the opposing Uni high quintet was having its best evening so far.

The Golden Tide started right off, grabbing the lead in the first minute of play and holding it all the way. Center Bill Klassen's pivot shot from the key opened the scoring for the Tide after 45 seconds of play.

Uni high built up a 9-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. With Jerry McInroe hitting long one hand shots from far out and Clausen canning them close in the winners built the count up to 25-13 at the end of the first half.

The Tigers couldn't get going at any time in the game against the close checking Tide. Uni high continued to pile up the count in the second half and held a 37-15 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Clausen led the scoring for Uni high with 14 points and Center Ed Bennett got 14 for Junction City but it was McInroe who captured the eye of the fans. The Tiger who shifted from a forward position to guard was causing Junction City no end of trouble with his long one-hand shots from far back and over near the side-line stripe.

The loss was the second in a row in district play for Junction City. The Tigers won two straight over Cottage Grove and Springfield but lost last week in a close decision at Roseburg.

The Uni high "B" squad, which has lost only one start this season, continued its streak with a 44-33 victory the Junction City reserves.

The Salem second string made a clean sweep by swamping the Miller "B" squad, 43-20.

The Millers now face a heavy week-end in District Six play with a game Friday night against the awakened Uni high team and a Saturday night date with the league-leading Roseburg Indians.

The Cougars jumped into the lead at the start and were never on the short end. Once they held a 15-point lead, with hthe score 40-25.

Last year's national top-scoring Vince Hanson spilled 24 points into the Cougar basket for high scoring honors.

The WSC victory pushed Washington out of first place in the northern division and unbeaten Oregon State takes over the number one spot.

Using a zone defense for the first time, Washington State forced the Huskies to resort to long shots to collect their tallies. A trio of tall Cougars—Hanson, Gene Sivertson and Ray Arndt—controlled the backboard effectively throughout the game.

Don Hanson mustered 10 points to pace Washington.
