

### Evidence Proves Nazis Subsidized Argentine Press

BUENOS AIRES, Jan. 18.—(U.P.)—The United States embassy presented photostatic evidence today that five Argentine newspapers were subsidized by Germany during the war.

Copies of telegrams found in Germany were released by Charge d'Affaires John Moore Cabot along with a statement that described three Argentine papers now functioning as "anti-American."

Cabot said two of the three papers were a continuation of two of the wartime group while the third was a recently founded paper which took over employees of some of the subsidized group.

The papers described as "anti-American" were La Epoca, La Tribuna and Democracia, all supporters of Col. Juan D. Peron's presidential campaign.

The five papers found to be subsidized were: El Pampero; Cabildo; El Pueblo, a morning daily connected with the Catholic church; the picture magazine Ahora; and the German language daily Deutsche la Plata Zeitung.

El Pueblo and Ahora are the only ones still publishing under the same names. The La Plata Zeitung, which was the Nazi organ in Argentina, now is published under the name Die Freie Presse.

### OPA Freezes Shingle, Soft Lumber Prices

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—(U.P.)—Retail prices which distribution yards may charge for western softwood shingles and northern softwood lumber will be "frozen" at December 1, 1945, levels, effective January 22, the OPA announced today.

Retail price ceilings for these sales now are calculated on the basis of a percentage markup over mill ceilings.

Recently mills were granted a price increase of \$2 per one thousand board feet of northern softwood lumber and 20 cents a square for western softwood shingles.

The immediate effect of the freeze is to require retail distributors to absorb these increases. Under the new regulations, ceilings for these products must be computed for maximum prices for mill sales in effect last December 1.

Wholesale distribution yards and wholesale type sales by retail yards are exempted from the new provision. In these cases the mill increase may be passed on to buyers.

### Autopsy Shows Ley's Brain Long Diseased

WASHINGTON, Jan. 18.—(U.P.)—The brain of the Nazi suicide, Dr. Robert Ley whose word was law over all German workers, had been diseased "for years," an army post-mortem has disclosed.

Army institute of pathology scientists who examined the brain after it was flown here from Germany, revealed last night they found a "long-standing degenerative process" that was "sufficient to have impaired Dr. Ley's mental and emotional faculties."

They showed this reporter the brain that once directed the seizure of trade unions in the Reich and sought to indoctrinate all workers with the ideas of the Fuehrer.

about developing industries using wood which will provide more jobs from less actual trees taken from our forests. To balance our forest economy means a reduction of our annual take from our forests for several years, until young forests all reach production."

Association officials, he said, are expecting production of about eight billion board feet of lumber in the Douglas fir region (Oregon and Washington west of the Cascades) in 1946. In 1945 only five billion, eight hundred million feet were produced.

Jacques Bernard Herzog of the prosecution reported a Nazi administrative meeting in September, 1942, at which Propaganda Minister Joseph Goebbels advocated working slave laborers to death as the best way to exterminate unwanted peoples and categories.
