Lutheran Churches To Raise 10 Million

More than 600 Lutheran churches affiliated with the National Lutheran council in the United States, including those in Lane county, soon will start a concentrated program to raise ten million dollars for people of war-torn countries.

Kai H. Nygaard, pastor of Emmaus Lutheran church in Eugene, announced Saturday that Lane county Lutherans will conduct a rally at Eugene high school at 7:30 p. m. Feb. 22 as the first step in the campaign. Guest speaker, he said, would be Rev. Dr. James P. Beasom, president of the California synod of the United Lutheran church, whose home is in Glendale, Calif.

Approximately 100 voices will form a mass Lutheran choir to sing on that night, Rev. Nygaard said.

The nation-wide campaign to raise funds in Lutheran churches has a two-fold purpose: to instruct 100,000 congregational workers and to give wide spread publicity to the necessity for assisting the people of Europe and other countries.

"So much current interest is focused on the needs of suffering humanity and the extreme need of financial help for orphaned churches and mission fields, that it is believed there will be a hearty response from the Lutherans of America," declared Rev. Nygaard.
