Synod Leader Here Friday For Rally

The Rev. James P. Beason, D. D., recently elected full-time president of the California Synod of the United Lutheran Church of America, will be principal speaker at a rally of Lane County Lutheran Church members at 7:30 p. m. Friday at Eugene High School.
 This rally marks the beginning of a campaign being conducted by the National Lutheran Council to raise ten million dollars for church relief and rehabilitation activities in this country and abroad. More than two and a half million American Lutherans are members, through their respective churches, of the National Lutheran Council.
 Local church officials reported that Mr. Beason has held the presidency of the California Synod for the past three years, in addition to his pastorate of the First Lutheran Church at Glendale, Calif. He is now president of the Southern California Lutheran Welfare Council.
 The National Lutheran Council represents the following Lutheran churches: United Lutheran, Augustana Synod, United Evangelical, Danish Lutheran, Lutheran Free Church and Suomi Synod.
