### U. S. to Pay Nazi Sailors

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senators learned Tuesday the navy expects to pay more than \$100,000 in wages and upkeep for a volunteer German crew on the Prinz Eugen, the Nazi cruiser which will be a target in the Pacific atom bomb tests.

The payment was disclosed when the Senate Appropriation Committee released printed testimony of its closed hearings on a deficiency appropriation bill. Rear Admiral Ezra G. Allen testified it was necessary to hire the crew to get the cruiser to this country.

The vessel is now enroute to the Marshall Islands, scene of the forthcoming bomb experiment.

### Landlords Can't Find 'No Vacancy' Signs

CHICAGO (AP)—Many Chicago landlords, with no apartments to rent, can't find "No Vacancy" signs to post on their buildings.

James Dameron, owner of a sign firm, said during the war manufacture of all metal signs dropped sharply and sign sellers kept only small stocks of "No Vacancy" signs on hand. Before the war the big demand was for "For Rent" signs, which now are selling at half-price.

Dameron said his firm turns out 6,000 "No Vacancy" signs weekly, but most of them are shipped to other cities.

### New Tacoma Bridge Planned

OLYMPIA, Wash.—(AP)—The toll bridge authority today approved plans for the new Tacoma Narrows bridge.

Highway Director Clarence Shain said that the financing and letting of contracts for the 28,000-foot span would begin as soon as negotiations for the insurance were completed.

Shain, who estimated the cost of the project at \$8,500,000, said the same piers as used on the old bridge, will again be used with some modifications. Shock absorbers, never before used on a suspension type bridge will be incorporated in the construction.

As a result of the years of research on special design to cope with the winds of the Tacoma Narrows, C. E. Andrew, consulting engineer of the project said that a series of slots will pierce the floor of the span, allowing air to pass through either way, equalizing the pressure on both sides at all times.

"Engineers all over the world are looking towards the new bridge with intense interest. The collapse of the old span cast a deep shadow on the basic theory of suspension type bridges. The new bridge will substantiate that theory," Andrew said.

The span, Andrew estimated, will stand an earthquake of the 10th degree or more. 22 thousand tons of steel will go into the bridge and will take 22 months to build.

DUNKIRK, N. Y.—(AP)—With groceries scattered helter-skelter around his store after irate housewives dumped them on the floor, a local grocer today pondered the wisdom of the old adage: "The first shall be last and the last first"—at least as applied to a butter line.

When the grocer started selling butter, he decided to reverse the procedure and start from the end of the line. He ran out, of course, and then women at the head of the line promptly dumped their groceries on the floor and stomped out.

### ARL Lumber Unions To Meet in Bend

PORTLAND (AP)—Contract negotiations will be discussed March 28-30 in Bend at a session of the Oregon Council, AFL Lumber and Sawmill Workers, Secretary Doyle Pearson said today.

AFL officials also will consider the AFL-CIO dispute which has shut down the Carnation Lumber Co. mill, Forest Grove, he reported. CIO workers have cut off the AFL-manned plant's log supply.

Representatives from Washington, Idaho and California locals along Oregon's border will attend the meet.

### Plan Drive to Finance Statues of Oregon's Historical Figures

PORTLAND (AP)—Selection of a sculptor to execute statues of

Dr. John McLoughlin and Jason Lee to represent Oregon in the nation capitol's statutory hall was deferred and a \$25,000 goal was set for a financing campaign.

The committee, authorized by the 1945 legislature, received sculptors' bids ranging from \$12,000 for a statue of Lee, pioneer Methodist missionary, to \$60,000 for both Lee and the Hudson's Bay company factor.

The statues, which will be seven to eight feet tall, are expected to be financed by a state-wide drive under the chairmanship of Dr. Burt Brown Barker.
