### California Institute Develops New Rocket

PASADENA, Cal.—(UP)—Development of a 16-foot, jet-propelled rocket that can climb more than 43½ miles for research in the upper stratosphere was revealed at California Institute of Technology.

The slim projectile, one foot in diameter, gets its power from liquid hydro-carbon and has a long, needle-shaped nose to travel at super-sonic speeds.

It was developed by Dr. Frank J. Malina, acting director of the Caltech jet-propulsion laboratory, and has been tested and approved by army ordinance.

Also there is a bathroom with a frosted glass door, four wardrobe closets, floor lamps, glass skylights, an electric washing machine beside the stainless steel sink, four-wheel brakes electrically operated, 14 lights on its masonry exterior and an automatic garbage disposal unit.

**Five Rooms**  
This model contains five rooms: living room, dinette, kitchen, bedroom and bath. It weighs about 8500 pounds and is 38 feet long. The first of next year it will be available to the public.

In these homeless, roomless days, the 70 companies wanting to make trailer coaches are so far behind in their orders they've almost lost track. Twenty-five firms exhibited here the models they hope to produce in quantity when sufficient materials can be had.

These models range in price from \$20,000 to \$1135; in weight from 9500 pounds to 1700; in length from 35 to 18½ feet.
