State Funds Denied Vel for Lot Purchase

SALEM.—(AP)—The state cannot loan money to veterans for purchase of lots on which homes will be built, Attorney General George Neuner ruled today for State Veterans Director Hugh E. Rosson.

Neuner pointed out that the veterans loan law provides for loans direct acquisition of farms and homes, and that a lot does not come under the law.

The question was raised when a veteran asked for a loan to buy two acres of vacant land in Eugene, the veteran asserting that he intended to build a home on the property.

"In the instant case," Neuner said, "should the loan be made, the use of the money as proposed might or might not result in the veteran acquiring a home. On the other hand, its use as proposed might result in a speculative venture in real property."
