End of Final Chapter Written By Lane War Industries, Inc.

Nineteen Lane County firms which for over four years have pooled their manufacturing facilities to expedite output of war materials have voted dissolution of the Lane County War Industries, Inc., the non-profit corporation in which they have worked together.

All funds advanced by local business firms, plus interest for use of the money during the agency's lifetime, will be returned, the corporation directors voted.

Produced Truck Bodies

The corporation's small business firms, including machine shops, wood-processing plants, electrical firms, contractors and similar operations, manufactured and assembled for the Army's Ordnance Department about 6000 wood cargo truck bodies in a volume of business amounting to approximately one and one-half million dollars. A. F. Richards, president, reported at the final stockholders' meeting.

The corporation was formed March 20, 1942, under special emergency provisions made by the Department of Justice, which waived anti-trust laws to permit pooling for war materiel manufacture. The work was done in Eugene shops, notably three planing mills and an emergency assembly plant, located in the Lane County Fairgrounds riding ring.

Appreciation Expressed
Fred Carlson was the corporation's first president and was succeeded by Richards when ill

health forced him to retire at the end of the initial year. Speaking before the stockholders, Richards expressed appreciation for Carlson's work and the group accorded special appreciation to the Eugene Chamber of Commerce and to O. A. Houghum, who was its Mrs. Glen Harnden (Kennell-Ellis photo, Wiltshire engraving), chairman of the Chamber's Industries Committee at the time the corporation was formed.

"The war proved to us that competitive business can and will work together for a common cause," Richards said in reviewing the work of the group.

Officers and board members of the corporation, in addition to Richards were J. O. Olsen, vice-president; Fred M. Brenne, secretary-treasurer; and Walter Schmieding, Tracy Stocker, R. H. Pierce, Wilbur Hyland and Leo Wickstrom, directors.

Chester Chase Buys \$10,000 Hereford Bull

Chester Chase of Royaldel Farms, Springfield, has purchased for \$10,000, Beau Domino 235th, a Hereford bull, from owner Curdie Martin at Stevensville, Mont., the Associated Press reports. The new bull will arrive at the Chase farm this week.

The Chester Chase herd started in 1940 with ten head of cattle; he also bought his first Curdie Martin heifers in 1940 and went to Montana each year for additional stock. The present herd numbers about 80 head, the majority being the Curdie Hereford strain.

Bought Real Silver Domino

Chase also owns Real Silver Domino 58th, which was purchased in 1942 from the Silver Creek Farm at Fort Worth, Texas, shortly before his sire sold for \$22,500.

Real Silver Domino 58th is a half-brother of the grand champion of the Treasure Island International Stock show in 1941 and a half-brother of the winner of the Chicago International Stock Show in 1942.

Oldest Family Herd

The dam of the new bull was the champion of the Portland International Stock show when a heifer. This brings to two the number of Curdie Hereford bulls owned by Chase.

The present Curdie Martin Herefords, which form the oldest herd in the United States operated by one family, are owned by the grandson of the original owner. The herd are noted throughout the Pacific Coast for their size, winning prizes in competitive stock shows and selling for the highest prices.
